
More Info

This is to explain the sys. beeps at different points in U-Review and to give quick descriptions of its different parts (most are self-explanatory).

<Location>(•#)
<Reason and Fix.>

•# Means that the following reason occurs in more than one similar place.

Main Window

You can't open a blank file for anything except adding to. So when you make a new file at least enter something on the first card (you can change it later).

See and Change

You can't go past the end of the deck of cards with either of the Previous/Next buttons or the GoTo button.

See and Change•1

You can't leave any of the sides of the card blank. (If you really want to just put a space in that field.)

See and Change•2

U-Review will not allow you to enter more than 250 characters on each side of the card.

Add to file•1

You can't leave any of the sides of the card blank. (If you really want to just put a space in that field.)

Note: The Done button *will* let you finish entering either on a *completely* blank card OR on a filled out card. Saving or not saving the card based on its content (filled or nil). (Next automatically produces a new blank card to fill out.)

Add to file•2

U-Review will not allow you to enter more than 250 characters on each side of the card.

New file

Note: New file pipes right into Add to file so see that for entering oddities....

About and Help

Note: From inside each of these you can get to the other....

Sequential Test

Note: The computer flips through the deck of cards asking you to name the corresponding Reply (or back side) on each card for its Query (or front side). When it gets to the end of the deck (as you had written it) it stops and returns to the main window.

Random Test

Note: Now the deck is shuffled before the computer starts "testing" you. However, when the deck is finished it reshuffles it and keeps on "testing" you. To stop it you have to click the Cancel button.

Backwards

Note: When checked this causes the deck of cards to be flipped over so that what you had entered as Replies are now the Queries and vice versa. (If this still does not make sense, just make a deck and try it; you'll see.)

Note: Each deck of cards may only be 100 cards long.
