

Dancing Lines Setup

Dancing Lines is a screen saver program designed to provide a pleasing display on your PC screen when you are not using it. It will prevent a pattern burning into the phosphor of your screen. It is also useful as a screen locking program when you implement the password protection feature.

This screen saver consists of up to 3 sets of coloured lines that form shapes and dance around the screen.

Ordering Information

The number of lines in the shape. At each time interval, a new line is drawn on the leading edge of the shape, and a line is undrawn (overdrawn in black) on the trailing edge. This causes the shape to appear to move across the screen.

0 lines - The shape is turned off.

40 lines - Maximum number of lines in a shape.

Each shape can be drawn in a constant colour selected from the 15 displayed in the list boxes, or it can be drawn in Shifting Colours or in Random Colours.

Shifting Colours shift slowly through the spectrum in a random manner.

Random Colours change with each time element giving a rainbow type of effect.

This Checkbox determines whether or not you need a password to end the screen saver and return to Windows. If the screen saver is password protected then the password may be set with the Set Password button.

The password may be set by clicking on this button and filling in the spaces in the Set Password dialog box. Since the password is not visible when you type it, you must type it correctly twice before Windows will accept it.

With the Sound Checkbox checked each shape's leading edge beeps as it bounces off the walls.

With the Clear Screen Checkbox checked the screen will be cleared to a black background before the shapes are drawn. If it is not checked then the shapes will eventually clear the screen as they pass over it.

The OK Button closes the Setup Dialogue Box and saves all of the settings.

The Cancel Button closes the Setup Dialogue Box without saving any of the changes you have made.

The Help Button runs the Windows Help program to display this help file.

This screen saver is a "shareware" program. In general this means that you are entitled to try it and share it with anyone else who would like to try it. If you like it, or even if you only use it, you are required to purchase a license for it.

Why you should buy.

- 1) You get a legal licence to use the program.
- 2) You get a copy of the program without the NAG screens.
- 3) In 6 months you get another copy of the program with any improvements that have been made.

The cost of the license to use this program, and a copy of the program without the NAG screens is \$10.00.
