

Overview



Have you ever used Internet and World Wide Web? If you did, you've probably seen lots of HTML (Hyper Text MarkUp Language) documents. Those pages which are really written in pure ASCII text format, when loaded into World Wide Web browsers, like Internet Explorer® or Netscape Navigator®, can provide you with lots of informations, pictures, multimedia files etc.

Web Styler, is a tool which will help you create professional and great looking World Wide Web pages in no time! It is equipped with lots of powerful tools, which can satisfy professional HTML authors, but also the HTML beginners and amateurs. Web Styler supports the newest HTML standards, including Microsoft Internet Explorer®, Netscape Navigator® and Netscape Communicator® browsers standards. In this way, you can be sure you will get the best results for a small price. Web Styler's features include:

Windows 95 Support: Web Styler supports long file names and extension (very useful for extension .html), drag and drop operations within the program, Windows 95 dialos, pop-up menus and other features supported in Windows 95. In other words, Web Styler i 100% Windows 95 compatible.

Easy-to-use Composers: Web Styler is equipped with three powerful and easy to use composers, better to say wizards which will help HTML beginners, but also professional to create Tables, Frames and Home Pages in no time!

Powerful tools: Right-Click tag editing, Open file at Cursor, Selection Change, HTML Debugger, Spell Checker, Style Sheets Editor and Code Editor are just few of many, many useful tools provided by Web Styler. These popular tools will help you to create your Web sites much faster.

Powerful Internal Previewing: Web Styler creates an OLE connection with Microsoft Internet Explorer, if you have it on your disk, and implements it in user interface. In this way, internal previewer is much more powerful than the ones in other HTML editors.


Web Styler is distributed as not crippled shareware. That means that the unregistered version of Web Styler is fully functional, as much as the registered version is, but it will allow you to run the program for only 50 times, after that you must stop using it, or register it. You can register Web Styler on many ways, to find out, read How to Register topic in this help. Web Styler costs 24,95 US\$.

Creating your first Web Page

In Web Styler, there are several ways to create your first World Wide Web document. As a text-based HTML editor, it offers two different possibilities: Creating only the basic HTML code, which is necessary for a World Wide Web browser to open the document properly, or creating the whole Home page with help of The Home Page Composer, available from Web Styler's Tools menu.

The basic HTML code can be created very easily using the toolbar or menu command. To insert Basic HTML code from Web

Styler's toolbar, use the button on the Extended Toolbar. The button looks like this: .

To insert the Basic HTML Code using the menus, select the command **Basic HTML Code** from the **Insert** menu.

After completing the operation, you should see HTML code in your document, similar with this one:

That is the basic HTML code, necessary for every HTML document. You can always use it for a quick start.

If you are a beginner, it is recommended to use Web Styler's Home Page Composer. You can run it by clicking the command **Home Page Composer** from the **Tools** menu. You will see a new window. Follow the instructions on the screen, and in a less than a minute you will have a very good Home Page ready for World Wide Web and Internet.

Learning HTML

Web Styler is, as you already know, text-based HTML editor, not WYSIWYG editor. That, of course means that you see the HTML code while you are creating your Web page. On the other side, WYSIWYG HTML editors, like Microsoft FrontPage® and Netscape Navigator Gold®, don't show the HTML code, just the previewed page. Therefore, if you decided to use Web Styler (which is a good choice, trust us), you should, learn Hyper Text Markup Language syntax, specifications, tags and standards.

Here, in Web Styler help, you can find some good HTML related World Wide Web sites. Visit them, and they will provide with lots of information on HTML, and learn you how to create good World Wide Web pages. When you learn HTML, in combination with Web Styler, you will make the best HTML duo!

System Requirements

Before you install and run Web Styler, you should check minimal system requirements needed to use Web Styler properly. If your system configuration doesn't satisfy the requirements, you should check by your hardware reseller to buy new components.

The minimal **hardware** configuration for using Web Styler on Windows 95® operating system is:

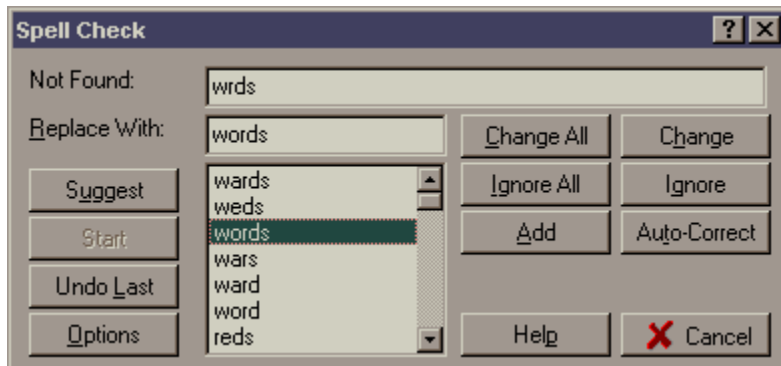
- IBM PS/2 or compatible machine with Intel® 80486DX or higher processor
- 8 Mb of RAM Memory

- Hard Disk Drive with at least 6 Mb of free space
- VGA or compatible graphical display
- Mouse or another equivalent pointing device

If you use Windows NT® 4.0, you need minimal system configuration needed for your operating system. You also need about 6 Mb of free space on you Hard Disk Drive.

Beside the minimal hardware configuration, to use Web Styler properly, you need to install Microsoft Internet Explorer® 3.0, 3.01 or higher. This software is free, and can be downloaded from Microsoft site, at the address <http://www.microsoft.com/ie/>.

Spell Checker



Web Styler includes, what we think, the most powerful built-in spell checking component of all HTML editors, which will help you to correct your spelling mistakes. The component supports more than 110,000 words. A very useful feature is skipping HTML tags - if you have ever spelled a HTML document with a normal spell checker, you will see what a relief is to have the one that skips tags. More useful features: when spell checking, you can get help any time using context sensitive help button on the spell checker main window and you can change spell checking options in the middle of the action. Made a mistake in spelling? No problem, the component supports unlimited **Undo** action. If you ever used spell checkers, like the one in Microsoft Word®, you won't have any problems with adjusting - the user interface is the same! You can also use Microsoft Word® user dictionaries to check for mistakes, just set them up in spell checking options. Great, isn't it?
