Making a Back-up Onto a Disk

SOHO Back-up interprets the back-up plan that you store on the destination disk. It makes the back-up to the very disk that contains the back-up plan. To make a back-up onto the destination disk:

Preparation

Copy or save the back-up plan that you want to use for that disk onto the disk. It is probably a good idea to place the back-up plan in the root directory of the disk. More than one back-up plan can be stored on the disk, using different file names.

The registered versions of the software have the ability to save different back-up plans into separate sub-directories on the destination disk. Then the different back-up plans on the disk can make separate back-ups to different destination directories.

Making a back-up

The back-up plan can be executed by:

- Using Explorer to find the back-up plan on the destination disk and double click on the file.
- Using Explorer to find the back-up plan on the destination disk, select the file and bring up the right mouse button menu, and then select 'open'.

Using the Start Menu to run the 'Automatic Back-up' program, and then using its dialog box to select the back-up plan to be used.
