Welcome to the A Brief History of Time CD-ROM.

RECOMMENDED SYSTEM CONFIGURATION:

Windows

It is advisable to have a MPC 486/25SX or faster, 8mb RAM, Windows 3.1 or higher, 640x480 256 color display, and a Double Speed CD-ROM drive.

To install the A Brief History of Time CD on Windows:

- 1) Insert the A Brief History of Time CD-ROM.
- 2) Open the File Manager and choose the disk drive that contains the A Brief History of Time CD-ROM.
- 3) Choose Run from the File menu.
- 4) In the Command Line field, type INSTALL.EXE after the disk drive name and click OK.
- 5) Follow the instructions on screen

IMPORTANT TECHNICAL NOTES:

Please make sure that you are not running any other software when using A Brief History of Time as this may cause decreased performance. If performance of the CD-ROM seems slow, you may want to enable Virtual Memory using the 386 Enhanced control panel available from the Main program group in the Program Manager. If you choose to enable Virtual Memory, we suggest that you use the Permanent Type setting for best performance.

If you experience strange display or audio problems we suggest that you contact the manufacturer of your video or audio card and obtain the latest drivers for your particular card. A Brief History of Time uses the latest in computer software technology and requires current, state-of-the-art software drivers to run properly. Also, make sure that your video driver is set to display at 640x480 resolution in 256 colors. Other display drivers settings may impact the successful use of A Brief History of Time.

You can improve performance of A Brief History of Time by enabling the faster speed settings on your double-, triple-, or quad-speed CD-ROM drive.

This product requires QuickTime for Windows 2.03 or later. It will install version 2.03 into your Windows System subdirectory. If you have one or more other QuickTime installations elsewhere in your system and you are experiencing problems, you may want to consider deactivating or removing the other QuickTime installations.
