### What is Vault?

Vault stores your information as an outline. Vault organizes your information into categories and subcategories that you specify.

For example, the Vault file below has "Calendar" and "Computer" categories. Under the "Computer" category are sub-categories of "Hardware", "On-Line Services", and "Software". Under "Hardware" is "Micron", and under "Micron" are "BBS" and "Notes". Since the "Notes" item has been selected, the text for that item is displayed in the text window at the bottom of the screen.



Vault's search command finds the information you need instantly. You can also browse the outline by expanding and collapsing items.

Vault's Send command allows you to send your notes to co-workers via electronic mail.

Vault's Dial Phone command automatically dials the phone number selected in the text window.

Vault's Print command allows you to specify which notes to print, and how they should appear. Vault's Print Preview command allows you to inspect the appearance of printouts before sending them to the printer.

### What's New in this Version

### Version 1.22 (32-bit only release):

Bug fix: In version 1.21 the text window's vertical scrollbar was sometimes not displayed appropriately when Vault was first run.

### Version 1.21 (32-bit only release):

Searches can now be restricted to just the selected outline items. In previous versions, the search command always searched all outline items. For further details, see <u>Search / Search</u>.

The status bar now displays "OVR" when the text window is in overstrike mode. The overstrike mode is toggled every time the Insert key is pressed.

The Ctrl+A accelerator (for Select All) was added to the Edit menu.

When the Vault document is empty, the following message is displayed in the status bar: ---> Select Outline / Add Below to add items <---.

#### Version 1.20 (32-bit only release):

Bug fix: In previous versions, when the topmost outline item was not visible but the listbox was big enough to display all items, the vertical scrollbar was disabled.

The on-line help text describing the enhanced editing features was corrected and expanded. See paragraphs 2 and 3 of the "Version 1.19" section below.

#### Version 1.19 (32-bit only release):

In previous versions, the text of each outline item was limited to about 32,000 characters under Windows 95. This limitation has been removed - outline items can now have up to 16 megabytes of text (under Windows 95 and NT). See <u>Limitations</u> for further information.

The text window now has enhanced editing features. For example, to select a word, double-click it with the left mouse button. To move text, select the text, then click the selection with the left mouse button and keep the button held down. Drag the cursor to the new location of the text and release the button. This mechanism can even be used to move text from another application (for example, Word for Windows, WordPad, etc.).

The above procedure will move the text to a new location and delete the text from the original location. If you want to retain the text in the original location, hold down the control key during the entire process.

Search hits are now underlined. See <u>Search / Previous Search Word</u> and <u>Search / Next Search</u> <u>Word</u> for further information.

The margin around the text in the text window is now identical to the margin around the outline window. In previous versions, the text window's margin was proportional to its font size.

Bug fix: In previous versions, after the last outline item was cut, the text window was not cleared and disabled.

Error corrected in the description of the <u>Vault File Format</u>. In section 3 H, the item state will be 1 (not 0) if the item contains subordinate items.

# How to Use Vault

## **Opening a File**

To open a Vault file, use the <u>File / Open</u> command. You may want to open "EXAMPLE.VLT" to learn how to use Vault.

## **Creating a New File**

To create a new Vault file, use the File / New command.

Vault has two windows separated by a movable "splitter bar". The top window is the outline window, and the bottom window is the text window:



For further information on the splitter bar, see <u>Move Split</u>.

### The Outline Window

### Selecting Items

Items in the outline window can be expanded and contracted by double-clicking them with the mouse. For further information, see <u>Outline / Expand</u> and <u>Outline / Collapse</u>.

To select an outline item, move the mouse pointer over it and press the left mouse button once. When you select one outline item, that item's text will appear in the text window.

To select a range of items, select the first item with the mouse. Then hold down the shift key and select the last item with the mouse.

To select multiple, non-contiguous outline items, hold down the Ctrl key and select items with the mouse. If you accidentally select the wrong item, just click it once again with the mouse.

When you select multiple items, the text window will be blank.

### Adding and Deleting Items

To add new outline items, use the <u>Outline / Add Above</u> and <u>Outline / Add Below</u> commands. To delete outline items, use the <u>Outline / Delete Items</u> command. To change an item's title, use the <u>Outline / Change Title</u> command.

### Indenting and Un-Indenting Outline Items

To change the indentation of outline items, use the Outline / Indent and Outline / Un-indent commands.

### Cutting, Pasting, and Copying

To cut, paste, and copy outline items, use the <u>Outline / Cut Items</u>, <u>Outline / Paste Items</u>, and <u>Outline / Copy Items</u> commands.

### The Text Window

The text window displays the current outline item's text and allows you to edit it. For further information, see Edit / Undo, Edit / Cut, Edit / Copy, Edit / Paste, Edit / Select All, Edit / Find, Edit / Replace, Edit / Insert Date, Edit / Insert Date and Time., and Edit / Insert Text File.

### Searching

Use the Outline / Search command to search for items.

### Printing

Use the File / Print Preview and File / Print commands to preview and print your Vault file.

### Saving a File

Use the File / Save and File / Save As commands to save your Vault file.

### Sending Outline Items via Electronic Mail

To send outline items via electronic mail, select the items and use the File / Send command.

### **Dialing the Phone**

To automatically dial a phone number, select the item containing the phone number and use the <u>Edit / Dial</u> <u>Phone</u> command.

# The Toolbar

The toolbar is displayed across the top of the application window, below the menu bar. The toolbar provides quick mouse access to many Vault commands. If you leave the mouse above a toolbar button for a moment, help for that button will be displayed.

To hide or display the Toolbar, choose Toolbar from the Options menu (Alt, p, T).

The status bar is displayed at the bottom of the Vault window. To display or hide the status bar, use the <u>Options / Status Bar</u> command.

The left area of the status bar describes actions of menu items as you use the arrow keys to navigate through menus. This area similarly shows messages that describe the actions of toolbar buttons as you depress them, before releasing them. If after viewing the description of the toolbar button command you wish not to execute the command, then release the mouse button while the pointer is off the toolbar button.

The right areas of the status bar indicate which of the following keys are latched down:

Indicator	Description
CAP	The Caps Lock key is latched down.
NUM	The Num Lock key is latched down.
SCRL	The Scroll Lock key is latched down.

Prints copies in page number order, instead of separated multiple copies of each page.

### **Print Quality**

Select the quality of the printing. Generally, lower quality printing takes less time to produce.

Some printers offer multiple trays for different paper sources. Specify the tray here.

#### Options

Displays a dialog box where you can make additional choices about printing, specific to the type of printer you have selected.

Choose this button to connect to a network location, assigning it a new drive letter.

This error message is given when the Search for box of the Search dialog box is left blank. Enter the text to search for in the Search for box.

## **No Items Found**

This error message is given when the Search did not find any matches.

#### **Out of Memory**

This error message is given when Vault has run out of memory, but the program can keep running. If you get this message, close down other programs to make more memory available.

Since Windows 95 and NT have better memory management than Windows 3.1, consider running the Windows 95 and NT version of Vault under Windows 95 or NT. For further information, see <u>Available</u> <u>Versions of Vault</u>.

#### Fatal Error. Out of Memory

This error message is given when Vault has run out of memory, and cannot keep running. If you get this message, close down other programs to make more memory available.

Since Windows 95 and NT have better memory management than Windows 3.1, consider running the Windows 95 and NT version of Vault under Windows 95 or NT. For further information, see <u>Available</u> <u>Versions of Vault</u>.

#### Invalid Filename

This error message is given when an invalid filename was specified. To solve this problem, go to the Options menu and select "Settings" and specify a valid filename.

## Press the Specify File Button to Select a File to Load on Start-Up

This error message is given when the "Load the following file on start-up" option was selected in the Settings dialog box, but a filename was not specified. To solve this problem, press the Specify File button and select a file.

## Cannot Save .BAK File

This error message is given when Vault cannot save a backup copy of a file when doing a File / Save or File / Save As. To solve this problem, make sure your disk has sufficient free space. If the .BAK file already exists, make sure that it is not read-only. Use the File Manager or the attrib command to do this.

## Title Must be Non-Blank

This error message is given when an outline item has been added, or an outline item's title has been changed, but the title was left blank. To solve this problem, enter a title in the Item Title box.

# The File That You are Loading Contains More Items Than the Windows 3.1 Version of Vault Can Load

This error message is given when the file that you are loading contains more items than the Windows 3.1 version of Vault can load. To solve this problem, use the Windows 95 and NT version of Vault. For further information, see <u>Available Versions of Vault</u>.

#### The Item Cannot be Inserted Because the Outline Listbox is Full

This error message is given when an outline item cannot be inserted because the Outline listbox is full. To solve this problem, use the Windows 95 and NT version of Vault. For further information, see <u>Available Versions of Vault</u>.

# **Cannot Insert Text File**

This error message is given when the Edit / Insert Text File command fails.

This error message is given when the Edit / Dial Phone command fails.

## **Cannot Export**

This error message is given when the <u>File / Export</u> command fails. This message usually appears when there is insufficient disk space to store the selected outline items in a text file. Make space available on the disk, or choose a disk with more space available.

#### Vault File Format

This topic describes how to create Vault files from other data sources. To read an existing .vlt file, see Note 7, below.

- 1. Create an empty binary file.
- 2. Write a DWORD containing the number of outline items.
- 3. For each outline item:
  - A. Write the item's title length (# characters) as a BYTE.
  - B. Write the item's title text as characters.
  - C. Write the item's text length (# characters) as a DWORD.
  - D. If the item's text length is <= 255, write the text length (#characters) as a BYTE.

If the item's text length is > 255, write 255 as a BYTE. Then write the text length as a WORD.

If the item's text length is  $\geq$  65534, write 255 as a BYTE. Then write 65535 as a WORD. Then write the text length as a DWORD.

- E. Write the item's text as characters.
- F. Write the item's nesting level as a WORD.
- G. Write 0 as a WORD.
- H. Write the item's state as a WORD. The item state will be 1 if the item contains subordinate items (in other words, if the item will appear as a book in Vault).

The item state will be 2 if the item does not contain subordinate items (in other words, the item will appear as a page in Vault).

#### Notes:

- 1. Write items in the same order that you want them to appear in the outline list box.
- 2. If you want to be able to use the .vlt file under Windows 3.1 and/or Windows 95, make sure that the length of the item text contains no more than 32,766 characters.
- 3. A BYTE is an unsigned character.
- 4. A WORD is an unsigned 2 byte integer.
- 5. A DWORD is an unsigned 4 byte long integer.
- 6. All integers are stored in Intel "little-endian" format. In other words, integers are stored with the least significant byte first, followed by the next least significant byte, etc.
- 7. In order to successfully read a .vlt file using the above information, you must first select Outline / Expand All and then do a File / Save or File / Save As.

## **Minimize Command**

Use this command to reduce the Vault window to an icon.

#### Shortcut

Mouse: Click the minimize icon - or

on the title bar. Keys: Alt+Space N

## **Maximize Command**

Use this command to enlarge the Vault window to fill the available space.

#### Shortcut

Click the maximize icon **D** or Mouse:

on the title bar; or double-click the title bar. Keys: Alt+Space X

## **Close Command**

Use this command to quit Vault.

#### Shortcut

Mouse: Click the close icon  $\bowtie$  on the title bar. Keys: Alt+F4

## **Restore Command**

Use this command to return the Vault window to its size and position before you chose the Maximize or Minimize command.

### **Move Command**

Use this command to display a four-headed arrow so you can move the active window or dialog box with the arrow keys.

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Note: This command is unavailable if you maximize the window.

#### Shortcut

Keys: Alt+Space M

#### Size Command

Use this command to display a four-headed arrow so you can size the Vault window with the arrow keys.

After the pointer changes to the four-headed arrow:

- 1. Press one of the DIRECTION keys (left, right, up, or down arrow key) to move the pointer to the border you want to move.
- 2. Press a DIRECTION key to move the border.
- 3. Press ENTER when the window is the size you want.

Note: This command is unavailable if you maximize the window.

#### Shortcut

Mouse:Drag the size bars at the corners or edges of the window.Keys:Alt+Space S

#### Title Bar

The title bar is located along the top of a window. It contains the name of the application (Vault) and the current document.

To move the window, drag the title bar. Note: You can also move dialog boxes by dragging their title bars.

# **Toolbar Docking Region**

The toolbar can be moved to this region and left here. To do this, press the toolbar with the left mouse button. Leaving the mouse button pressed, drag the toolbar to the docking region.

## Size Vault's Window

To change the size of Vault's window, press the left mouse button over the window border and drag the mouse.

#### Scrollbars

To move the outline or text window contents up or down, or to the left or to the right, use the vertical and horizontal scrollbars. You can control the scrollbars by clicking them with the mouse, or by pressing the Page Up, Page Down, Home, End, and arrow keys.
