Opus 5.5, there's an ARExx module [mrjQuote.dopus5](#), which can load mrjQuote as required and provide access to it via internal Directory Opus commands.

The requester buttons have the following purpose:

OK: Closes the requester, but leaves mrjQuote running. (Only available if CDITY or AREXX given) Quit: Exits the program completely. Another: Pops up a new quote.

The flexible [QuoteList format](#) allows you to reference several smaller files by having instead of a file full of quotes a file containing a list of files, one of which will be chosen at random (and which itself may be either full of quotes or links to other files. If a Quotelist/SigList is not supplied from the CLI or Workbench, then the files set in the [configuration](#) will be used. By default, this is PROGDIR:QuoteList and PROGDIR:SigList.

## 1.4 mrjQuote : Random Signatures

Random Signatures ~~~~~ To cater for the ever-increasing number of Amiga owners who use their machine to access the Internet, mrjQuote now provides a facility to generate random signature files for appending to emails or news articles. As well as a random quote, you can specify files which may be attached to the beginning and/or end of every signature, perhaps giving your email address and web page URL. Remember however that netiquette suggests that signatures should be limited to four lines. A special selection of one/two line [Babylon 5](#) quotes has been included for this purpose. Don't to forget to include an ASCII jumpgate <\*> the internet symbol of Babylon 5 fandom (unless, of course, you're not a B5 fan - in which case, why not?). You can generate a signature file either by pressing the appropriate button in the [configuration window](#) or, more conveniently, via a [commodities hotkey](#). You can also do so via the [ARExx port](#) - perhaps automatically from your mail or news program or [text editor](#).

## 1.5 mrjQuote : The Configuration Window

Configuration ~~~~~ Under Workbench 2 or above, mrjQuote has its own configuration window. The window can be opened via the [Commodities Exchange](#), a hotkey, or an {"ARExx" link ARExx} message. On opening the window, the current settings will be saved in the file T:mrjQuote.prefs for use with Cancel.

Gadgets:

The three hotkeys and port name can be changed by editing them directly in their string gadget (note that changes will not be seen unless you press enter or refresh the configuration window). The ARExx port name cannot be changed interactively, but if saved will be used next time you load mrjQuote. You shouldn't really change it unless you have a very good reason, as most ARExx scripts will also need altering. The filenames and font name can be clicking on the adjacent button to pop up a standard file or font requester. If one of the letters in a button is underlined then Right-Amiga plus that letter is a keyboard shortcut to that function.

Setting the Message of the Day:

mrjQuote has the ability to insert a text file at the top of the first quote produced in a requester after a reboot. You could, perhaps, use this to give your name and address in case your beloved Amiga should 'stray'. To enable this facility, simply create a file ENVARC:mrjsq/MOTD containing the required text.

## 1.6 mrjQuote : Use as a Commodity

Use as a Commodity ~~~~~ Under Workbench 2 or above, mrjQuote can install itself as a commodity. This allows you to control some aspects of the program via hotkeys and the commodities exchange.

Default Hotkeys:

(these can be changed from the **configuration window** )

**Pop up a quote** left-alt control Q **Configuration window** right-alt control Q **Generate a signature** alt control S

Control via the exchange:

Activate/deactivate hotkey passing. **Show** or **Hide** the configuration window. **Remove** mrjQuote.

Note that no commodity events can be processed whilst a quote/file/font requester is open, although they should be queued.

## 1.7 mrjQuote ; Use of ARexx

Use of ARexx ~~~~~ Under Workbench 2 or above, mrjQuote can open an ARexx port which will allow you to have a large amount of control over the program via ARexx, either directly or using other programs. To utilise ARexx, you'll need to have the program REXX.MAST either in your WBStartup drawer or user-startup script. By default, the ARexx port is called "QUOTE". This can be changed via the **configuration** , but note that this change will not take effect until mrjQuote quit and restarted (assuming that this change has been saved), and will entail manual alteration of any ARexx scripts other than mrjQuote macros.

List of ARexx commands:

Note that there have been changes since v2.20. (Get and Set have replaced some older commands.) All commands are case-insensitive.

**Quote** [<QuoteList>] **Reply** [<QuoteList>]

**Sig** [<SigList>] **Open**

**Close Use**

**Save SaveAs** [<PrefsFile>]

**Load** [<PrefsFile>] **Cancel**

**Quit Get** <Variable>

**Set** <Variable> [<FileName>] **Macro** [<MacroName>]

Most of the commands perform the same function as gadgets/menus of the **configuration window** with similar names, albeit with the option to supply filenames directly rather than popping up a file requester. Reply can be used to get quotes in a format suitable for further processing by an ARexx script, and Get & Set allow you to find and/or change some of the filenames used by mrjQuote. Note that setting RESULT from Blitz 2 programs doesn't seem to work, so the value that should be in RESULT is also stored in the file T:mrjQuote. See the supplied ARexx scripts for examples of usage. Note also that the ARexx port is frozen whilst any requester is open. Commands will, however, be queued and executed once the requester is closed. ARexx commands will be replied to only when the operation they cause is completed (eg after a file is created or a file requester closed), with the exception of 'Quote' which will reply immediately and 'Macro' which will reply once the execution request is sent to ARexx.

Errors processing ARexx commands:

If an error occurs during the processing of an ARexx command, RC will be set to one of the following values:

10 - No such command 11 - Unable to open file 12 - No such variable (Get/Set) 13 - Unable to open T:mrjQuote (Reply/Get)

Supplied ARexx scripts:

**mrjQuote.rexx** - CLI replacement for using Quote directly **mrjQuote.dopus5** - ARexx Module for Directory Opus 5.5 **IndentAddSig.ged** - GoldEd 4 macro for use with email etc **IndentAddSig.bed** - Blacks Editor macro for use with email etc

Don't forget to read the documentation contained in the scripts themselves and carry out any necessary configuration before use.

## 1.8 mrjQuote : Adding More or Different Quotes

Adding More or Different Quotes ~~~~~ mrjQuote gets it's quotes from a QuoteList file. See [configuration](#) for how to specify which QuoteList is used. This QuoteList can be in either of the two formats below:

List of Quotes:

This is the basic file, containing the actual quotes. The first line gives the number of quotes in the file. The remainder of the file is the quotes, each one preceded by a line starting with two percent characters '%%'.

List of QuoteLists:

More advanced, this allows you to split your quote collection over several smaller files, speeding up access times. The first line gives the number of QuoteLists referred to. Each line in the remainder of the file can reference either a QuoteList or a directory. A reference to a QuoteList can either give a full path, including device (ie containing a ':'), or a relative path (most usually just the filename itself) from the current directory. The current directory is initially the directory in which the file be parsed resides, but any line which refers to a directory (this must end in a trailing / or :) will change the current directory for future QuoteLists. If a relative directory is given, this is relative to the directory in which the file be parsed is, not the current directory.

Take a look at the quote files supplied for a better idea. The basic file format is the same as several other quote or fortune generators, which should make it easier to find new quotes. I'll try to keep a reasonably up-to-date (with UK showings) set of Babylon 5 quote files on my B5 Web page: <http://users.ox.ac.uk/~kebl0206/babylon5/>

## 1.9 mrjQuote : Babylon 5 Episode List

Babylon 5 Episode List ~~~~~ Babylon 5 is a space science-fiction television series set over five years between 2257 and 2262 based on a space station of the same name, which serves as a neutral meeting place for both humans and many alien races. What sets B5 apart from its competitors is the pre-planned five year storyline, a gritty realism, and the way that major characters, places, governments and even whole alien races can come and go. The Babylon 5 Quotes supplied with mrjQuote are organised on an episode-by- episode basis. Note that there are not quote files for every one of the episodes listed yet (at the time of writing, only the first three seasons have been screened and I haven't got quotes for all of them yet).

## 1.12 mrjQuote : System Requirements

System Requirements ~~~~~ An Amiga! (Surprise, surprise) Workbench 2 or better is required for anything other than just printing a quote to the CLI (or generating a signature) and then exiting. mrjQuote has not been tested with lower OS versions - chances are it may not work at all, or even crash. If it is 1.3 compatible at all, then that's more by accident than design - 1.3 is obsolete now. A Harddisk is preferable if you're going to be using the program as a commodity, with ARexx or for large or numerous Quote files, and will certainly speed things up immeasurably. Tested on an A1200/020/28MHz with 4 megs Fast RAM and a hard disk.

## 1.13 mrjQuote : Technical Details

Technical Details ~~~~~ mrjQuote consists of over 900 lines of code using Blitz Basic 2.1 by Acid Software. Compile time is a little over 4 seconds on an 020/28. Feel free to compile your own version if there are any things you want to change - conditional compilation is set up to easily remove some of the major features if you don't want them (thus reducing executable size), although this is done fairly simply and there are doubtless other bits of code which could be removed as well. Details, and a list of 3rd party libraries required for compilation are included at the top of the code. Remember that you are NOT permitted to **distribute** altered code or executables. However, if you have implemented a feature that you think others might find useful, feel free to get into contact with **me**.

## 1.15 mrjQuote : Distribution

Distribution ~~~~~ This software is Freeware. Feel free to give it to your friends, force it on your enemies or feed it to your dog (but only if you've first transferred it to some suitably edible media). The software should only be distributed as is, complete with source code, scripts, images and documentation. If space is very tight, the quotes may be omitted. You may

not distribute modified versions of the executable, source or scripts under any circumstances. If you have any improved code, feel free to contact me about including it in the next release - you'll get full credit. Additional scripts and QuoteLists are also welcome. If you use this program regularly, then please think about 'registering'. A lot of work has gone into this project and while some of it is for my benefit, some (for example this documentation) is solely to the benefit of others. I've no way (or desire) to enforce the rules below, but if you don't even bother to boost my ego by telling me how great you think this program is, then don't be surprised if my associates come along to slice'n'dice you...

If you use this program regularly, you are morally obligated to:

1) Watch **Babylon 5** (You won't regret it) 2) Buy Directory Opus 5.5 (you won't regret that either) 3) Send **me** a gift. At the very least an email or SnailMail telling me how much you like/hate it (and pointing out any bugs you've found, or suggesting some improvements), but feel free to send something else as well: money, chocolate, programs you've written (preferably registered versions if they're shareware) or whatever else takes your fancy. If you send me an email address, I'll try to keep you informed of any updates or other programs that I write. Remember that requests for improvements are more likely to be carried out if they come with some form of gift.

This archive may be placed on Aminet, and any similar free-access FTP sites, BBSs, Aminet CDs and Fred Fish's AmigaLibrary. I think. v2.02 Fixed to work with any size window title font. v2.03 **About requester** added and default hotkeys changed. v2.04 Improved **quote file list format**, improved parsing of files and CLI arguments plus use of mrjQuote as default tool for icons on quote files. Can read files of quotes directly. v2.05 **Font used by GUI** can now be changed. v2.10 GUI window is now resizable, 'Test' tests new font also. v2.11 Basic **ARexx port** added. v2.12 Window resizing and font testing speeded up. v2.13 First test of **.signature generation**. v2.14 Signature generation now fully integrated with configuration. v2.15 Minor bugfixes and cleanups, ARexx port expanded. v2.16 **Load...** and **Save...** preferences. v2.17 Bug in ARexx port fixed, **episode list** added to documentation. v2.20 Third release. v2.21 More **command-line functionality** added. v2.22 Code largely rewritten with a much clearer format and no GOSUBs. Future possibilities:

Use of ReqTools: Nicer file and font requesters, better other requesters (unless you're using Arq). Requesters can be asynchronous, meaning that the the program isn't locked when a requester opens. AppIcon/Window/Menu support: I reckon that this is a bit too gimmicky, but if anyone desparately wants it, it can be done. Anything else that you suggest to me....

## 1.18 mrjQuote: Actions : About mrjQuote

**Menu** Project / About **Keyboard** Right-Amiga A

Pop up an about requester. In addition to the usual stuff, this will also detail mrjQuote's commodity name and ARexx port name (if appropriate) and if ARexx macros are available.

## 1.19 mrjQuote: Actions : Cancel configuration changes

**Gadget** Cancel **Menu** Preferences / Cancel **Keyboard** Right-Amiga C **ARexx** Cancel

Reset the configuration to what it was before the last time the configuration window was opened and close the configuration window if it is still open. Equivalent to: **Load T:mrjQuote.prefs Close**

## 1.20 mrjQuote: Actions : Close configuration window

**Gadget** Window close-gadget **Exchange** Hide Interface **ARexx** Close

Close the configuration window if it is open. No files will be loaded or saved. See also: **Use Cancel**

## 1.21 mrjQuote: Actions : Set GUI font

**Gadget** GUI Font

Pops up a requester allowing you to change the font used in the configuration window's gadgets and menus. The font may be proportional, and size is limited only by screen height. The configuration window will be redrawn if it is open.

## 1.22 mrjQuote: Actions : Get / Set configuration variable

**ARexx** Get <Variable> **ARexx** Set <Variable> [<FileName>]

Store one of the configuration variables in T:mrjQuote where it can be read by an ARexx script (supposed to be returned in RESULT, but that doesn't work), or set one of the **configuration** variables to a given filename (including full path, will pop up a file requester if no file supplied). The possible variables are:

**QuoteList SigList SigFile SigPre SigPost**

## 1.23 mrjQuote: Actions : Load configuration

**Gadget** Load **Menu** Preferences / Load **Keyboard** Right-Amiga L **ARexx** Load [<PrefsFile>]

Load the configuration from a file. This may be supplied (with full path) via ARexx, in any other case a file-requester will be popped up. All current settings will be overwritten, and the configuration window will be redrawn if it is open. See also: **SaveAs**

## 1.24 mrjQuote: Actions : Execute ARexx Macro

**Gadget** Rexx Name **Menu** Project / Macro **Keyboard** Right-Amiga M **ARexx** Macro [<MacroName>]

Execute an mrjQuote ARexx macro. This may be supplied (with full path) via ARexx, in any other case a file-requester will be popped up. This ARexx script will then be executed with mrjQuote as the current host port.

## 1.25 mrjQuote: Actions : Open configuration window

**Gadget** Configure **Exchange** Show Interface **Hotkey** Configuration Key - Default: Right-Alt Control Q **ARexx** Open

Open or refresh the configuration window. If the window is not open, then the current configuration will be **saved** in the file T:mrjQuote.prefs before it is opened.

## 1.26 mrjQuote: Actions : Set QuoteList file

**Gadget** QuoteList **ARexx** Get / Set QuoteList [<FileName>]

Pops up a requester allowing you to set the default QuoteList. A file may be specified directly when using ARexx.

## 1.27 mrjQuote: Actions : Quit mrjQuote

**Gadget** Quit **Menu** Project / Quit **Keyboard** Right-Amiga Q **Exchange** Remove **ARexx** Quit

Quit mrjQuote. No warning will be given.

## 1.28 mrjQuote: Actions : Pop up a quote

### 1.34 mrjQuote: Actions : Set signature list

Gadget SigList **ARexx** Get / Set SigList [<FileName>]

Pops up a requester allowing you to set the default QuoteList. A file may be specified directly when using ARexx.

Allows you to select a file which will (if it exists) be appended to any random signature generated. A file may be specified directly when using ARexx.

### 1.38 mrjQuote : ARexx : mrjQuote.rexx

mrjQuote.rexx ~~~~~ This **ARexx** script is intended for use instead of loading Quote directly from the CLI. It offers several advantages: the Quote executable will not be run again if a version with an ARexx port is already running, and it is possible to install mrjQuote as a commodity or with ARexx producing a quote to the CLI. You can also tell an already running copy of mrjQuote to open its configuration window or quit. For more details, see the documentation contained within the script itself.

### 1.39 mrjQuote : ARexx : mrjQuote.dopus5

mrjQuote.dopus5 ~~~~~ This is an **ARexx** module for Directory Opus 5.5 which has similar functions to the **mrjQuote.rexx** script. It creates two internal Opus commands which can be used to control mrjQuote, and can optionally load mrjQuote when DOpus is started. An added bonus is the ability to pop up quotes using Opus 5 requesters rather than directly from mrjQuote - thus avoiding the problem of locking up mrjQuote. For further details, see the documentation contained within the script itself.

They can be used to indent quoted text and also to create and append a random signature. The exact functionality will depend on particular editors.
