1.2 Introduction

A while ago, I didn't have any kind of unarchiver, and I was really fed up having to do it manually all the time.

After a while, I thought to myself "Why don't I do one myself!", and this is how ArcExtract was born. a few weeks after that, I got a modem, and I realised that there were loads more programs than this one, but anyway. Maybe I'll make a better version some time in the future.

1.3 System Requirements

Doesn't really need much, but here is what you need:

- OS1.3 or OS2+
- ReqTools library
- PowerPacker.library
- Lha/Lzx archives?

1.4 Installing

Simply click on the Install icon supplied with this package.

NOTE: The install script needs the Standard Escom Installer. If you do not have the installer, all you have to do is copy the ArcExtract drawer across to the desired destination and then copy the libraries to the LIBS: drawer on your system.

1.5 Using under OS1.3

1. Click on the "Source File" gadget and select the appropriate archive.
2. Click on the out "Output Path" gadget, and select a destination path.
3. Click on the gadget "Extract"
4. When the message "Done!" comes up, that's it!

NOTE: Development of ArcExtract has not been very good when relating to OS1.3. Future development of ArcExtract will exclude OS1.3

1.6 Using under OS2+

Using ArcExtract under OS2+ is the simplest form. All you have to do is click on the icon. If you haven't used it before, it will ask you for an output path. Select where you want it to go, and it will save that path as a tool type for future use.

When ever you want to extract a file, simply drag it to the AppIcon and when the message "Done!" comes up, it will have extracted to the selected path.

1.7 Using though CLI

The command is: ArcExtract [Source Archive] [Destination Path]

Do something like this:
