1.2 Introduction

At the time of the #amiga97 IRC conference I took a look at Aminet to find an AmIRC logfile stripper but didn't find any working ones.

So I decided to make my own and make it as good as possible.

1.3 Requirements

LogConvert requires an Amiga computer with KS 2.0+ and a little free RAM.

1.4 Usage

The program has to be run from CLI.

```
LogConvert [filename] [#channel] [slideshow] [simple] [complex] [columns n]
```

```
filename: the filename of the input file  
          a ".LC" suffix will be added to the output filename
```

```
#channel: which channel to convert
```

```
slideshow: the lines will be printed to stdout with small delays  
           instead of writing them to an output file
```

```
simple: convert only messages
```

```
complex: convert everything - messages, joins, mode changes etc.
```

```
columns n: wordwrap at n columns, where n>40
```

If you leave (some of) these command line options out, the program will ask for them. The slideshow option makes an exception though.

You can break the program by pressing ctrl-c.
