

Jim Collas was a Senior Vice-President of Product Development at Gateway. Jim brings with him years of experience, and a reputation for getting things done. Jeff Schindler will remain as Manager of Product Development and will report directly to Jim Collas.

Before working for Gateway, Jim was the president of Anigma, Inc., a PC system board and motherboard design and development company which he founded in 1987. At Gateway, Jim has been mostly involved with product development, serving as the department's Vice-President and now Senior Vice-President.

Various Gateway VPs have had their hand at monitoring the progress of Amiga Inc. Starting with Rick Snyder, other VPs like Joe Burke and Steve Johns have always influenced the direction of Amiga Inc.



Amiga Announces New President and Fast-track Development Plans

Amiga Inc. and Amiga International representatives, under the leadership of new Amiga President Jim Collas, have met to hammer out the details of technical, strategic and marketing plans which will see the launch of new Amiga-based computers for the next millennium. The company has relocated its headquarters to San Diego.

"Amiga is an amazing opportunity that we must act on now or it will be lost forever," said Collas. "The Amiga platform is ideal for Internet-ready, consumeroriented digital appliances of the future. The Amiga name is associated the world over with user-friendly, low cost, powerful computing. We will take this philosophy into the next generation, enabling products from hand held Internet appliances to high-end graphics computers that help the user rather than frustrate them."

Collas, formerly the senior vice president of Product Development and Management for Amigas parent company, Gateway, will be running Amiga as a wholly independent subsidiary operation. Amiga Inc. and Amiga International will be integrated under the new Amiga corporate structure. Under Collas, the company will be able to step up a "fasttrack" development program that is currently underway.

Amiga is planning to launch next generation products worldwide before the New Year. They will be announcing detailed product plans and introducing several of their strategic partners over the summer. Products currently targeted for the initial launch are a development system, an Internet appliance, and a low cost home computer in the tradition of the Amiga A500 that dominated home computing in the late eighties and early nineties. The developers system will be available with a software development suite for low cost development on the new platform.

Jeff Schindler, in charge of product strategy for Amiga, is planning the new Amiga product line. "The Amiga community has been doing incredible things on a platform that holds enormous potential," said Schindler. "They deserve a system which lets them show off their talents."

Amigas administrative center in San Diego will shortly be complemented by a software development center under the leadership of Dr. Allan Havemose, Vice President of Engineering for Amiga, in San Jose, California. The Silicon Valley team will be rapidly expanded over the coming months to develop revolutionary Amiga multimedia layers over the real-time Neutrino OS core from QNX Software Systems Ltd.

Petro Tyschtschenko will continue on as Managing Director of Amiga International and will also play a critical role in guiding the current Amiga community through the transition to the new Amiga architecture. "The new Amiga plans are a rebirth for Amiga and an exciting journey into the future," said Tyschtschenko.

The Portal is not finished, nor will it ever be, it's a constantly evolving flux, just like the Web itself. So, be prepared for even more content very soon, as we get the engine running.





One of the main attractions expected at this year's Gateway Amiga Show is the release of Boxer board by Access Innovation's Mick Tinker. The Boxer's development is being subsidized by Amiga dealers Blittersoft of the UK, and Antigravity here in the US. Many Amigans have waited with great expectations for the Boxer to be released, but due to various reasons the Boxer has been delayed up two years. During my visit to Los Angeles, I paid a visit to Dan Lutz owner of Antigravity.

According to Dan, a final prototype and production schedule is due about a week before the show. Dan was gracious enough to show me an older prototype of the Boxer motherboard, as well as the modern ATX case that it will be housed in. As an extra incentive, Dan has lowered his pricing to \$1495 for a basic "Neila 498" configuration. For this price you get 68060 @ 66MHz, 16MB Ram, 2GB HardDisk 24xCD-Rom, High Density Floppy, 56K Internal Modem, Internet Software Kit, and a ClickBoom Game Bundle







Older Version of the Boxer Motherboard

The Boxer motherboard sports some nice features many Amigans have been clamoring for. Most noticeable is that the AGA chipset is now on one chip. This was mainly due to the dwindling supply of existing AGA chipsets from the Escom liquidation. The motherboard itself follows the ATX form factor.

The Boxer motherboard features new logic to support the newest revision of the EDO SIMM chips. Apparently there were some changes to the EDO standard that has made some SIMMs incompatible with Amiga accelerators produced by Phase5.

The Boxer motherboard can autodetect between Amiga and Window's keyboards. The ISA slots will be active for the AmigaOS. Plans are in the works for drivers to common PC Eithernet cards and such. Lastly, the Boxer has a slot for a PowerPC expansion to be offered

later this year. Dan stated that at first only complete units will be sold to the public. Eventually dealers would be able to order just the motherboard for their own clones.

Delays have hampered development of the Boxer. First, Mick Tinker had to reorganize his company Index due to supply issues caused by Amiga International on an Italian order. Second, Mick Tinker spent time developing the PCI Amiga card that was to be used on the developer "bridge system". At this time it is unknown if Amiga Inc is still interested. Third, minor revisions and bug fixes that are commonly expected on such a project.

AMIGA International, Inc. and Amiga, Inc. will conquer as one team the computer world; under the management of Jim Collas - and you my dear Amigans, will be a part of it.

Help us performing our goals.

Jim Collas will inform you within the next days about the organization, plans and goals of our company.

A very exciting time is coming and it is for me and my staff a honor to be a part of a new computer generation as pioneer and to pave the way for the future just like it was at Commodore. Long live our beloved Amiga and our community




Collas' Executive Bio


From the NORTH:

- From 495 get into the EXIT LANE for GW Parkway & Rt. 193 on American Legion Bridge.
- Get off exit 13 and turn LEFT onto Rt. 193.
- ♦ At the FIRST stoplight, turn RIGHT onto Balls Hall Road.
- At Church Hill Road turn LEFT. After bridge, turn RIGHT onto Ingleside Avenue.
- Turn RIGHT on Oak Ridge Avenue.
- The library is on the LEFT side of the road.



From the SOUTH:

- On 495 get off EXIT 11, Rt. 123 toward McLean.
- Continue through FIVE stop lights, about 1.8 miles.
- Turn LEFT onto Ingleside Avenue.
- Turn LEFT onto Oak Ridge Avenue.
- The library is on the LEFT side of the road.
