1.2 Introduction

Introduction

TaskiSMS is a programme that can be used to send short messages to the cellular phones. I got the idea of writing it not that long ago while sitting (as usual) in front of my Amiga busy thinking about that I am lazy enough not to do anything. :-) Herewith I would like also to "thank" the company called DCE Computer Service GmbH from Oberhausen (Germany), which managed to deceive me and hasn't sent my gfx card back for six months already. If they couldn't repair it, they could at least send it back so that I would have a nice wall decoration. Still it seems that some obvious matters and way of thinking are beyond their possibilities. Thus it was that state of mind that I decided to break with TaskiSMS programming.

And so it happened. The first TaskiSMS marked with a 1.0 version number began its existence. I was really happy to see that it has won itself a big popularity. This fact gave me the motivation required to develop the next versions. WIthin two weeks the 1.1 and 1.2 versions were already available on the Aminet. Those two had already a possibility to send SMs to a few foreign (to me) countries including Italy and Germany. The latter one almost especially for the gentlemen from DCE company. I corrected also a few minor bugs and a major one that I don't tell you about ;-) During that time I received hundreds of letters with suggestions on the possible improvements of the programme. I read all of them and have chosen those that were most frequent. It formed my brain to a state when it could create the TaskiSMS in its 2.0 version you are about to read about...

P.S. I apologize that I couldn't answer all the letters I received. Simply put if I did - I wouldn't have time to create the TaskiSMS v2.0

The requirements

The requirements presented here are not really firm and depend on many different factors.

Hardware:

- Amiga;

- KickStart 2.0+;
- a little bit of RAM;

Software:

- Magic User Interface (MUI) version 3.8. MUI is a Stefan Stuntz copyrighted package and can be ordered at http://www.sasg.com/
- OpenURL package is required for the banners. It is actually not strictly required but strongly suggested. Troels Walsted Hansen is the author of the package. You can find it on Aminet in comm/www/OpenURL30.lha ftp://ftp.wustl.edu/pub/aminet/comm/www/OpenURL30.lha
- Popplaceholder MUI custom class written by Marcin Orlowski ftp://amiga.com.pl/pub/mcc/MCC_Popph.lha

Every other person on this planet is herewith granted a free license to use the programme for its own non-commercial purposes.

In return you are asked to click the banners on the bottom of the main window. When you do this you give me some support through my sponsors and a kind of motivation for further development.

1.10 How to send SM

How to send a SM

The rule of thumb: If you are in doubt, read the bubble help!

Of course you have to start TaskiSMS. It doesn't matter being it Lite or Pro. ;-) Then you have to open the settings window from the menu Preferences->Preferences.

In the settings you have to give your name (first and last) as well as the signature (if you like to use it). You need also to put the SMTP server's address there. The best way would be to put the address of the server YOU usually use for your e-mail transport. If you don't have any idea of what is "your SMTP server" - you may alternatively leave the "smtp.taski.com.pl" there. If you like to use a proxy server - you have to put its address there too.

When finished with the settings you may start editing your first SM. If you are using the TaskiSMS Pro, you will have to click "New" on the toolbar.

First thing after that is to put in the number of the phone you want the SM to be sent to. It has to be typed in using the international phone number format. I.e. it needs to include the "+" sign as well as the country code afer it. For example if you want to send a SM to Poland, you need to type +48xxxyyyyy where "+" is the "+" ;-) "48" is the international country code for Poland "xxx" is the operator's code (prefix) and yyyyyy is the actual phone number. A full example would be: +48501654321

If the number you entered is a valid one (at least the country and operator's code), you should see the country and the operator on the left. Unless the operator is a new and not yet covered one of course.

The next thing is to choose the right plug-in to be used to send your SM through. You do it by pushing the popup button in the upper right corner of the window.

So. You may start writing your SM then. You do this by typing into the text editor area in the central part of the main window. The length of the message will be displayed on the counter in the lower right corner just above the banner. Remember: SM is a SM ;-) "Short Message" means Short Message... ;-)

And finally there is only one step (click) left. "Send now" button will do the trick and (if everything happens to be OK) your SM will be sent to the recipient's phone.
