1.2 A few choice words from me

Who are you?

My name is Gerard Sweeney, and regular readers of YS may just remember me from the Practical POKEs section... For the last few years of that great magazine's life, I was one of the main hack contributors to that section (in fact, at the end I was the only one, beside Jon North and his various pseudonymns... A sad, but true fact)....

What on earth is this?

Well, anyone who has bought the Limited Edition gold CD RETRO GOLD will no doubt have found that it suffers the same problem as the other Speccy CDs (like Speccy Sensations 1,2 & 96). In other words, there are so many snapshots in scabby IBM 8.3 filename standard, that there are lots of dupes, renames, and filenames which make no sense at all.

What I've done is to go through every single snapshot on my emulator and make up a file list sorting the games in alphabetical order.

How does it work?

Quite simply, the index is sorted alphabetically by game name (not snapshot name, as that would have been stupid).... If you want to load a game, just go to the appropriate letter for that game, with the exception of anything starting with "THE", where you would go by the first letter of the second word in the game's name....

Once there, just click on the name of the game you wish to load, and if you use ZXAM (and if not, why not?), it will load the emulator (if not already loaded), load the snapshot, and run the game.

To achieve this, it runs a script I wrote called ZXAM_RUN.REXX which is located in the REXX: directory. This is a complete rewrite of the original script which came with ZXAM, which had the unfortunate side effect of not working at all!

However, this works slightly differently if you chose to link it with Hack Attack III....

Hack Attack III?

Hack Attack III is a really good POKE guide written for use with ZXAM. It has POKEs for over 1000 games, almost all of which have been tested! It did have one drawback however, as Rastan wrote it in such a way that you had to load the game with the emulator, go to the POKE menu, enter the POKES, then go back to the emulator window. Not a big hassle, but this index program runs an AREXX program which will update all of the Hack Attack III guide files which have a snapshot on the Retro Gold CD. It will add a "LOAD" and a "RUN" button to the file, so that you can do it all from one window...

However, if you are using this version, it doesn't use this rather cool feature I'm afraid, so you'll have to install Hack Attack III first, then re-install this package, and say "YES" when asked if you have Hack Attack III installed. Simple really :-)
