1.2 The law-side of this

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takes no responsibility for errors or crashes or lost datas. Usage is YOUR OWN will and YOUR OWN risk. If you use parts (maybe bootblocks) of xInstall's source by your own, you have to note in your doc or tool that these parts are copyright © by Jens Tröger.

Please copy the xInstall-Drawer, not the single xInstall or it's source or it's guide. Keep them together, so others do know, what this doc is about and they have no trouble installing xInstall.

1.3 What Freeware is (or should be...)

Freeware means, that you can copy the soft as long as you want, but the rights are still by the author. And you MUST NOT patch the Code anyway! Freeware is like PD (Public Domain). PD is low cost soft, you should have to pay only the disk, not the tools on this disk.

1.4 What does xinstall, where do you need it

```
xInstall is a GUI-based, extended Install-command.

(GUI: Graphic User Interface)

OR: you can install

bootblocks

to floppydisks without typing any command

in CLI or Shell (like the good old Install). You can install 5 internal
bootblocks or you load and file-saved bootblock and install it. See

1.5 How 2 start

1.6 How 2 use xInstall

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Usage is very simple (I think):

You can start xInstall from Workbench, double-clicking it's icon, or type "<PATH>xInstall" from CLI or Shell.

There are 4 Buttons at the bottom of the window. Maybe there are some disabled, but this only means, that there is no drive available through xInstall's startup. I call them drive-buttons.

Use the Cycle "Bootblock" to select the bootblock

NOTE: to enter the scroll-text for

scroller

-bootblock, you have to click

the drive-button first. A requester appears and you may enter the text.

NOTE: if you select

(File)

as bootblock, you can SELECT the path/file of

the bootblock, but xInstall loads the bootblock \mbox{AFTER} selecting a drive-button.

Use the Cycle "FileSystem" to select the file-system of the bootblock.

At the right side of the Cycle "Bootblock" are two gadgets (a Button "?" and a String), that make you able to select the path/file of the bootblock to load. While not selecting "(File)" at Cycle "Bootblock", both are disabled. If "(File)" is on both become enabled. Use "?" to set up a file-requester or use the string to enter the path/file.

The meaning of the button $\boldsymbol{"}$

About

" is easy, isn't it ?!

To quit xInstall select the close-gadget or type "q".

If you want to localize xInstall into YOUR language modify the xinstall.CT file and compile it. To do this use MakeCat by Paladin Software or CatEdit by Rafael D'Halleweyn. Both you can find in PD. If you do I want to please you to send me your catalog, so I can put it into the xInstall-package and lots of other users can work with this catalog.

1.7 The bootblocks

There are 5 internal bootblocks:

DOS cleared

...only the DOS-ID, the FileSys and the Root-Pointer. Else 0-bytes.

Standard

The one and only, the simpliest and shortest real bootblock. The original since... (ooops sorry !) Again: the original from Commodore.

Message

While bootup a message appears: "No virus on bootblock".

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Scroller

This scrolls the text you entered while bootup. Again and again. Press left mouse-button to exit.

MemCheck

Checks the system's captures while startup. If there is someone NOT zero (which could indicate a virus), an alert comes up and shows all captures. Exit the alert with left mouse you will ignore the message, right mouse does a really cold reboot and resets the captures. But if your system is OK, the screen should become green (hope so...)

And if you want you can load a bootblock-file from disk. Use the (File) to deal with bb-files:

You can select (with help of the two gadgets at the right side) a file, which is a saved bootblock. xInstall checks this file before installing it and tells you if it was NO bootblock.

1.8 About xinstall

xInstall is Freeware

reqtools.library is copyright © by Nico Francois.

xInstall is a tool to install more than one bootblock

to disk. Should be

localized and runs from both, Workbench and CLI/Shell.

The layout was created with GadToolsBox (copyright © by Jaba Development). But for making the code smaller and speed-up I did much work on the code.
