# CrossReferencing

## ***Crossreference BookMark by Text***

I am a particular reference selection bookmark

I reference the text< I am a particular reference selection bookmark> directly.

I reference the text<I am a particular reference selection bookmark> as a hyperlink

## ***Crossreference BookMark by Pagenumber***

I reference the pagenumber of the reference text <6>

I reference bookmark 1's pagenumber with above/below <1>

I reference the reference bookmark with above/below <6>

I reference the line below me with above/below <6>

I reference the final bookmark with above/below <7>

I reference the final bookmark with above/below without hyperlink <7>, this only matters as to whether word should take a click on it to mean jump to that location

## ***Crossreference BookMark by above below***

Reference above <above>

Reference below<below>

## ***Attempts to Break Crossreferencing BookMarks***

I am a link to the external bookmark on page 6
