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About the Filter Selection Dialog Box

The Filter Selection dialog box supports the Audio Compression Manager (ACM). From the Filter Selection dialog box, you can do the following:

- Choose an existing filter effect
- Create a custom filter effect
- Save a new filter effect
- Remove an existing filter effect
- View the available filter types and attributes

Choosing a Filter

The Name box lists all currently defined filter effects. The name of the filter effect usually indicates the manner in which it affects the data. For example, a filter effect that increases the volume could be called Loud.

- To select a filter effect, choose its name in the Name box.

When you select a filter effect, the Filter and Attributes boxes display the effect and attributes associated with the filter you selected.

Changing the Filter or Attributes

To create a new filter effect, you can change the format or attributes of an existing effect, then save the changes using a new name.

When you change the filter or attributes of an existing effect, Untitled appears in the Name box until you save your changes.

To change the filter or attributes of an effect:

1. Select the name of the existing effect.
2. In either the Filter or the Attributes box, click the arrow to display the available choices. Select the choice you want.

The choices available in the Filter and Attributes boxes will vary depending on your system configuration.

Saving a New Filter Effect

After you have selected the filter and attributes for a new effect, you must save the settings using a unique name. After you do, the name will appear in the Name box as an existing filter effect.

To save a new filter effect:

1. In the Filter Selection dialog box, select the filter and attributes you want for the effect.
2. Choose the Save As button. The Save As dialog box appears.
3. In the Save As dialog box, type a name for the new effect.
4. Choose OK to return to the Filter Selection dialog box.
5. In the Filter Selection dialog box, choose OK to return to the application.

Removing an Existing Filter Effect

You can remove any existing effect. You cannot remove Untitled from the list of effects.

To remove a filter effect:

1. From the Name list, choose the name of the effect you want to remove.
2. Choose the Remove button.

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
