CLOCKSVR Version 1.1

This is a screen saver program that will show you the date and time on a black screen when your computer times out in Windows. It works like all the other screen savers that come with Windows.

To use this program as a screen saver, place CLOCKSVR.SCR in your WINDOWS directory. You can then use the Desktop Icon under the Control Panel to select it as your screen saver.

There are a few options you can set by choosing the Setup on the Desktop Control Panel under the Screen Saver Section. The following is a description of each of these options.

What to Show: You have the choice of having the Date and Time Display, just the Date or just the Time.

Display Mode: You can have the output float arround your screen or have it randomly jump from loaction to location.

Speed: Controls how fast the output either floats or jumps.

Color to Display Time: What color the output is when the Time is displayed.

Color to Display Date: What color the output is when the Date is displayed.

Password: Click the password button on the control screen to set up a password, so that once the screen saver kicks in, no one will be able to access your computer without first knowing the password you have set up. If a password currently exists, you will first have to type it in to gain access to the password set up screen. Once there, type in your password twice, once in the Enter Password box, and once in the Verify Password box, then click OK. The two inputs must match. *To disable Password protection*, leave both text boxes blank. Passwords <u>are not</u> case sensitive.

Once you have run the set up, a file called *CLOCKSVR.INI* will be created in your Windows account. This file keeps track of your settings. The password portion is encoded with a simple random algorithm. Modifying CLOCKSVR.INI could have disasterous results. If you do this, and the program stops working, just erase CLOCKSVR.INI, and it will then use the program's default settings.

This program was written in Visual Basic 3.0. You may distribute this program freely, as long as you include this file(*CLOCKSVR.WRI*) with it.
