Control Bar



[Exit](#)(Esc) Click this button to quit the application (or click the Escape key).



[Export](#)(Alt+S) - Click this button to export a picture to your hard drive or second floppy drive. The picture can be saved as a standard Bitmap or GIF image.



[Print](#)(Alt+P) - Click this button to print any textual comments you typed about each image.



[Help](#)(F1) Click this button at any time to get help about Slide Show.



[Delete](#)(Delete) Click on this button to remove any picture from the Slide Show. Be careful with this function, it is irreversible.



[Rotate](#)(Alt+R) Click on this button to rotate any picture 90 degrees Clockwise.



[Copy](#)(Ctrl+Insert) - Click on this button to copy the selected area of a picture to the Windows clipboard (as a Bitmap). To select a portion of a picture, drag the cursor over the area while holding down the mouse button. A box will be drawn around the area. Note: if nothing has been selected, the entire picture is copied.



[Show](#)(Alt+A) - Click on this button to run an automatic slide show of your pictures. Pictures will display one by one for about 5 seconds each. The Automatic Slide Show will cycle through the images continuously until you press the button again, which stops the Automatic Slide Show.



[ThumbNails](#)(Alt+T) - Click on this button to display small "thumbnail" pictures. In the upper right corner of the screen, click the Rotate menu option to rotate the currently selected picture 90 degrees (clockwise or counter-clockwise). Double-click on a thumbnail to close the thumbnail window and show that particular image.



[Previous](#)(Alt+Left Arrow) Click on this button to display the previous picture (or use the arrows on your keyboard).



[Next](#)(Alt+Right Arrow) Click on this button to display the next picture (or use the arrows on your keyboard).

What is Slide Show

Slide Show is an image browsing utility that displays pictures one at a time, all at once in the ThumbNails, or in an Automatic Slide Show of one after another. Pictures can be rotated and comments can be added to each one. Slide Show also allows you to convert the images into other standard image formats (Bitmap or GIF) for use in word processing, paint programs, etc.

The entire Slide Show program is contained on the floppy disk with your images. The program can be run from the floppy disk or copied and run from the hard drive. To run Slide Show from the hard drive, copy everything on the disk to a directory on your hard drive.

How to use Slide Show

Any time you want to look at your Slide Show disk, place the diskette into the floppy drive and Type A:\Setup (A being the name of your floppy drive). To copy the Slide Show to your hard drive:

1. Place the Slide Show diskette in your floppy disk drive.
2. Open the File Manager from the Windows Program Manager.
3. Select all of the files on the Picture disk and choose Copy under File. Type the name of the directory where you want to keep the Slide Show.

When picture show opens, your pictures are displayed in the ThumbNails (thumbnail size), which allows you to rotate images as well as view any image. To rotate an image, first click on it once (putting the Frame around it), then select Rotate (clockwise or counter clockwise). To view an image in full screen and close the ThumbNails, double-click on a thumbnail picture.

When you are viewing full images, select the right arrow to view the next picture and the left to view the previous. These images can also be run as an Automatic Slide Show by clicking the Show button.

Navigating

When Slide Show opens the ThumbNails is displayed. To view an image, double-click on it. When viewing in full screen, click the right arrow to view the next image and the left to view the previous.

Automatic Slide Show

Start the Automatic Slide Show by clicking the Show button. Pictures will be displayed sequentially, one after another. To stop the Automatic Slide Show, click the Show button again, or click the Escape key.

ThumbNails

The ThumbNails is displayed when you first run Slide Show. Pictures are shown in thumbnail size, and can be rotated. To Rotate an image, click on it once (placing a frame around it) and select Rotate Clockwise or Counter-Clockwise. To view an image and close the ThumbNails, double-click on the picture you want.

Copy to Clipboard

A picture or part of a picture can be copied to the Windows clipboard (and then Paste into other programs) by clicking the Copy button. To select part of a picture, hold down the mouse button and drag the cursor over the area to be copied. Click the Copy button when your ready to copy.

Exiting Slide Show

To exit the Slide Show, click the Exit button on the control bar, or hit the Escape key.

Exporting Pictures

Pictures can be exported for use in word processing, Paint programs, etc. Slide Show exports these images as Bitmaps (BMP) or GIFs. These are standard file formats that work with most programs that accept pictures.

Printing Pictures

To print your pictures, either convert them to bitmap or GIF and import them into Paint Brush, or copy the image to the clipboard and paste it into your favorite word processor.
