# **Boston Terrier**

## Animated Cursor Set Version 1.0 Installation Instructions

Congratulations! You've just downloaded the neatest little set of animated cursors around. Just follow the installation procedures, and you'll be on your way to testing out Boston Terrier.

(Reminder: If you don't have Windows<sup>®</sup> 95 or Windows  $NT^{TM}$ , then you can't use Boston Terrier. Sorry!)

The downloaded self-extracting file, "Boston10.exe" contains the following files:

Setup9.wri:	This text file containing the installation procedures for the			
	Boston Terrier Animated Cursor Set			
Demo9.zip:	A compressed file containing the 3 demonstration cursors			
Order.wri:	An Order Form for purchasing the full set of the Boston			
	Terrier Animated Cursor Set			
Catalog.wri	A catalog file listing the cursor sets available from K 'n S			
	Associates. Along with the cursor set names, the file			
	includes catalog numbers, unit prices, and color pictures to			
	represent the cursors.			
Full9.zip:	A compressed file containing the full set of 12 Boston			
-	Terrier cursors (requires a password to decompress)

To purchase a <u>full</u> version of the Boston Terrier Animated Cursor Set, or any of the cursor sets, print out the order form located in the file "Order.wri" and mail it along with your check or money order today. You will then be emailed a password for each set you order that will enable you to unzip (decompress) the file containing the full set of cursors (Full9.zip). Or, if you prefer, you may order an uncompressed version of the cursor sets which you will receive via U.S. Mail on a floppy disk (U.S. orders only).

The following is a list of the <u>full</u> version files contained in the "Full9.zip" file and the Windows<sup>®</sup> 95 and Windows NT<sup>TM</sup> cursor/pointer types for which they would best be used (these are only suggestions):

<u>Note:</u> The "Demo9.zip" and "Full9.zip" files require WinZip<sup>®</sup> 6.1 to decompress. If you do not already have WinZip<sup>®</sup> 6.1, you can download an evaluation version from the WinZip<sup>®</sup> Internet site at http://www.winzip.com. Instructions for Extracting Files from a zip archive can be found in the **Brief Tutorial** under the WinZip<sup>®</sup> **Help** pull-down menu.

Windows® 95 Installation Procedure

- 1) If you have not yet ordered the full set of Boston Terrier cursors and received a password, do step 1a to decompress the demo files. Otherwise, do step 1b to decompress the full set.
  - a) Open the file "Demo9.zip" using WinZip<sup>®</sup> and extract all three of the demo files into any folder (the Windows Cursors folder would

probably be best). Go to step 2).

- b) Open the file "Full9.zip" using WinZip<sup>®</sup>. Click on the WinZip<sup>®</sup> **Options** pull-down menu and click on **Password**. Enter the password you received via email, then click **OK**. Extract all twelve of the full version files into any folder (the Windows Cursors folder would probably be best). Go to step 2).
- 2) Open the **Control Panel** by either:
  - a) Click on Start, select Settings, click on Control Panel, or
  - b) Double click on My Computer, then double click on Control Panel
- 3) Double click on **Mouse**
- 4) Select the **Pointers** tab
- 5) For each of the cursor/pointer types listed above for Windows<sup>®</sup> 95 (three for the demo or twelve for the full set):
  - a) Select the pointer type (e.g., Normal Select)
  - b) Click the **Browse** button
  - c) Change to the directory (folder) in which you extracted the Boston Terrier cursor files in step 1).
  - d) Find and select the Boston Terrier file that corresponds to the pointer type selected in 5a.
  - e) Click **Open**
- 6) To save this pointer scheme:
  - a) Click the Save As button
  - b) Type in a name for your scheme in the **Save Scheme** dialog box (e.g., Animated Boston Terrier)
  - c) Click **OK**
- 7) Click **OK** to close the **Mouse Properties** window and begin enjoying Boston Terrier!

## Windows NT<sup>TM</sup> Installation Procedure

- 1) If you have not yet ordered the full set of Boston Terrier cursors and received a password, do step 1a to decompress the demo files. Otherwise, do step 1b to decompress the full set.
  - a) Open the file "Demo9.zip" using WinZip<sup>®</sup> and extract all three of the demo files into any folder (the Windows Cursors folder would probably be best). Go to step 2).
  - b) Open the file "Full9.zip" using WinZip<sup>®</sup>. Click on the WinZip<sup>®</sup> **Options** pull-down menu and click on **Password**. Enter the password you received via email, then click **OK**. Extract all twelve of the full

version files into any folder (the Windows Cursors folder would probably be best). Go to step 2).

- 2) Double click the Main group, double click Control Panel
- 3) Double click on **Cursors**
- 4) For each of the cursor types listed above for Windows NT<sup>™</sup> (three for the demo or twelve for the full set):
  - a) Select the cursor type (e.g., Arrow)
  - b) Click the **Browse** button
  - c) Change to the directory (folder) in which you extracted the Boston Terrier cursor files in step 1).
  - d) Find and select the Boston Terrier file that corresponds to the cursor type selected in 4a.
  - e) Click **OK**
- 5) To save this cursor scheme:
  - a) Click the **Save Scheme** button
  - b) Type in a name for your scheme in the **Save Scheme** dialog box (e.g., Animated Boston Terrier)
  - c) Click **OK**
- 6) Click **OK** to close the **Cursors** window and begin enjoying Boston Terrier!
