<u>INSTALLATION</u>

If you received Editeur on diskette:

- 1. Insert the Editeur diskette into a drive. View its content with the Explorer and double-click INSTALL.EXE.
- 2. Optionally, modify the installation directory proposed and press the **Install** button. Editeur will be installed in the chosen directory.

If you received Editeur in a zip file (ED24U9.ZIP):

- 1. Unzip the zip file into either a *temporary directory* or onto a *diskette*. View its content with the Explorer and double-click INSTALL.EXE.
- 2. Optionally, modify the installation directory proposed and press the **Install** button. Editeur will be installed in the chosen directory.
- 3. If you used a temporary directory you should copy that directory onto a diskette in case you need to reinstall Editeur in the future. You will then be able to delete the temporary directory.

UNINSTALLATION

- 1. Choose Add/Remove programs in the control panel
- 2. Choose Editeur and press the Add/Remove button

REGISTERING - CompuServe

Editeur can be registered via the CompuServe on-line service. Sign on to Compuserve and type GO SWREG for more details. The Registration ID number is 1737, and the title is EDITEUR V2.4 for Windows 95. The cost is charged to your CompuServe account. CompuServe orders are \$ 24 US.

<u>Note</u>: CompuServe registerees will receive their identification key by CompuServe Mail. The latest version will be available on CompuServe's Windows Shareware Productivity Forum - GO WINPROD. No diskettes will (need to) be shipped.

HISTORY OF VERSIONS

September 1996:

Versionn V2.4: New dialogs support added for Windows NT 4.0. Minor bug fixes.

September 1995:

Version V2.3 for Windows™ 95. 32 bits version using the new Windows™ 95 dialogs. This version also works with Windows™ NT 3.51 and Win32s 1.30. Various bug fixes and evolutions.

July 1995:

Version V2.2 : context-sensitive help, indentation and unindentation of the selection, configuration and launching of external tools, recursive searching for files, spell checker (distributed separately, 16 bits version only), use of special characters \t (tabulation), \r (return), \n (newline), \\ (backslash) in search and replace.

April 1995:

Version V2.1: word wrap, column and rectangle selections (mouse right button). Edit Append, Window Tile horizontal and Window Tile vertical. Opening of files in read-only mode. History of strings searched and replaced. Various print fixes. Conversion of the software to native 32 bits and rewriting of the display functions.

October 1994:

Version V1.5: use of the common dialog box library for file and printing handling. Refresh, copy to, paste from, select all menus. Font menu split into screen font and printer font. Unix files handling. Macros, sortings.

April 1994:

Version V1.4: handling of bold and italic fonts, choice of the printer, page header and footers. Improvement of the Help Sytem. Minor bug corrections and improvements. Use of 3D dialogs (excellike). Availability of a Windowstm NT version.

January 1994:

Version V1.3: addition of a toolbar. Modification of the dialogs for an optimal placement whatever the screen resolution.

Bug corrections: no text end detection in some particular cases of searches.

November 1993:

Version V1.2a: access to new versions is included with the registration.

Bug corrections: incorrect month when inserting date/time. Incorrect Insert Point moves in some particular cases.

September 1993:

Version 1.2, fully shareware: unregistered and registered versions are now functionally identical. The installation, now automatic, creates a group of programs for Editeur in the Program Manager, and allows association of suffixes to the use of Editeur in the File Manager. Windows™ version 3.0 compatibility is not maintained further.

Bug corrections: memory violation during conversion selection for a single text. Bad management of long lines (involving several thousand characters).

Functional evolution: drag-and-drop support under Windows_m version 3.1. Selection moving to uppercase or lowercase lettering, date and time insertion.

March 1993:

Version 1.1, multi-windowed, number of lines unlimited, overall size limited by the memory available (development of a specific edition window "USEREDIT" and of a specific memory management algorithm).

Further to the basic functions, advanced functions of this version working under Windows[™] versions 3.0 and 3.1 are : opening of several files in one single dialog, font choice, history of file opening, undo/redo/repeat functions without level limitation, powerful and multi-text search and replace functions, conversion of tabulation width, on-line help. ...

A demonstration version limited to 100 lines per text was broadcast on 25 French BBS's, with the full version being purchased from the author.

August 1992:

Version 0.2, multi-windowed limited overall to 8192 lines (use of the standard edition window "EDIT" and of the function GlobalAlloc for each line allocation).

June 1992:

Version 0.1, single-windowed limited to 32 K bytes (use of the standard edition window "EDIT").
