WinAlarm offers Windows users a one-time, popup alarm utility for use

within a single, 24-hour time period. Once the alarm has been set, WinAlarm will sit quietly as a clock icon at the bottom of your screen. When activated, WinAlarm pops up, flashes your designated message in the title bar, beeps and displays a multi-colored blinking main screen with digital clock.

1. Start WinAlarm and click on Message. Enter any reminder such as, Feed the cats! If you choose not to enter a message, the titlebar defaults to WinAlarm.

2. Enter the alarm time you want and click on Alam Ale. The button will change to Alow M and the screen will become a

Oclock icon at the bottom of your screen.

3. When the alarm sounds and the main screen pop up, you can choose either to click on Exit or click on the button **Assum**. This button then changes back to

Alam Alian and you are ready to enter a new time and/or message.

4. WinAlarm's main screen position can be moved to wherever you wish. Whenever you click on Exit, WinAlarm remember's its last position. This program will pop up over any running application but will not interfere with the current program.
