Introduction to Aunt Annie's Crafts

Aunt Annie's Crafts combines learning with fun. Select a craft book from the Bookshelf Screen and open it to enter the world of crafts. Each book has a theme like paper crafts, paper airplanes, gift wrapping, puppets, or games to make. There are twelve or more projects in each book.

Each project includes a variety of designs to choose from, patterns to print, and easy to follow instructions. Also included with each project is a story or poem and some facts and ideas for fun things to do. Choose the paper airplane project and learn the basics of aerodynamics (flying). Choose the mouse project and read a poem about a mouse and a cat.

Learn how to do the crafts by following the easy step-by-step instructions for each project. Do some of the projects or all of the projects. See how much fun crafts can be!

Getting Started with Aunt Annie's Crafts

First, open the program group for Aunt Annie's Crafts by double-clicking on the Aunt Annie program group icon. Then, to start Aunt Annie's Crafts, simply double-click on the program icon. (From the keyboard, press the enter key after selecting the program icon.)

All of the screens in Aunt Annie's Crafts have a similar format. A set of action buttons run down the left hand side of each screen. While most of the buttons change from screen to screen, every screen has Help and Stop buttons. Buttons can be activated by clicking on them or by pressing Alt+<key>, where <key> is the underlined character on the button face. (In most cases you can simply press <key> without the Alt to activate a button, but when this fails use the Alt+<key> combination.) Each screen has an informational window at the bottom, look here for instructions specific to a screen.

The main part of each screen usually offers you selections. Up to twelve books, projects or project designs are offered to you at a time. Make a selection by clicking on its picture or by using the arrow keys or Tab and Shift+Tab. The selected item will have a black border with the title in white letters on a black rectangle. If you double-click on a picture or press return after making a selection, the action on the first button is taken. If more than twelve selections are available, Next and Back arrows are displayed in the lower right corner of the screen. These buttons allow you to see additional screens of selections, and are activated with a click or by pressing Alt+N or Alt+B.

The main part of the How To Do the Project screen shows instructions for completing the project step-by-step. Each step is displayed on a separate screen. To go to the next step click on Next or press Alt+N. To go to the previous step click on Back or press Alt+B.

Bookshelf Screen

This screen shows the project books available. From this screen you can open a project book, get a summary of its contents, or view the book's introduction.

The Bookshelf Screen has four major areas:

- The action buttons run down the left side of the screen.
- The **book display** is in the center of the screen. Icons for up to twelve books can be displayed here. A book is selected by clicking on its icon with the mouse or moving to it with the cursor keys.
- The **information window** is at the bottom center of the screen. Simple instructions and quick help are displayed here. To see quick help for a button or book icon, point at it with the mouse.
- The **back/next arrows** are displayed in the lower right corner of the screen if there are more than twelve project books available. Only twelve project books can be displayed on the **BOOKSHELF** screen at one time. The <u>Back</u> and <u>Next arrows are used to switch from one set of book icons to another when there are more than twelve books.</u>

ACTION BUTTONS

This action button is used to open the selected project book. Open a project book by clicking on the **Open** button with the mouse or by pressing the **'O'** on the keyboard.

This action button is used to get a description of the selected project book. The description includes the project titles, the materials list, and difficulty ratings. To see the contents of a book click on the **Contents** button with the mouse or press the 'C' on the keyboard.

This action button is used to display the introduction to the selected project book. Each project book has a unique introduction. An introduction may be a story, interesting facts, a brief history, or craft techniques related to the book's subject. To see the book's introduction click on the **Intro** button with the mouse or press the **'I'** on the keyboard.

This action button will display a list of books for further reading related to the selected book. To see the book list click on the **Library** button with the mouse or press the **'L'** on the keyboard.

This action button will display the **About** dialog box for Aunt Annie's Crafts. To see the **About** dialog box click on the **About** button with the mouse or press the 'A' on the keyboard.

Copyright and contact information is displayed in the dialog box. More detailed information may be seen by clicking on the **Credits**, **Copyrights** or **Order** buttons. Click on any of these buttons to display a pop-up window with a scrolling box of information. Scroll through the information by clicking on the up and down arrows and return to the **About** dialog box by clicking on the **QK** button. When you have finished with the **About** dialog box you may return to the bookshelf screen. Click on the **QK** button to return.

Click on the **Order** button for product and ordering information. You will also find brief descriptions of additional books for Aunt Annie's Crafts. Click on the **Print Order Form** button to send an order form to the default printer.

This action button will display help for the current screen. To see the help click on the **Help** button with the mouse or press the **'H'** on the keyboard.

This action button stops Aunt Annie's Crafts. To exit from Aunt Annie's Crafts click on the **Stop** button with the mouse or press the **'S'** on the keyboard.

Project Selection Screen

This screen shows the projects present in the opened book. From this screen you can select a project or see a description of a project.

The Project Selection Screen has four major areas:

- The **action buttons** run down the left side of the screen.
- The **project display** is in the center of the screen. Icons for up to twelve projects can be displayed here. A project is selected by clicking on its icon with the mouse or moving to it with the cursor keys.
- The **information window** is at the bottom center of the screen. Simple instructions and quick help are displayed here. To see quick help for a button or project icon, point at it with the mouse.
- The **back/next arrows** are displayed in the lower right corner of the screen if there are more than twelve projects available. Only twelve projects can be displayed on the project selection screen at one time. The <u>Back</u> and <u>Next arrows</u> are used to switch from one set of project icons to another when there are more than twelve projects.

ACTION BUTTONS

This action button is used to open the selected project. Open a project by clicking on the **Open** button with the mouse or by pressing the **'O'** on the keyboard.

This action button is used to display information about the selected project. The information includes a brief description of the project, a list of materials needed and a difficulty rating. Get information by clicking on the **Info** button with the mouse or by pressing the 'I' on the keyboard.

This action button is used to return to the **BOOKSHELF** screen from the **PROJECT SELECTION** screen. The project book will be closed. Return by clicking on the **Return** button with the mouse or by pressing the 'R' on the keyboard.

This action button will display <u>H</u>elp button with the mouse o		en. To see the help click on the board.			
This action button stops Aunt Annie's Crafts. To exit from Aunt Annie's Crafts click on the Stop button with the mouse or press the 'S' on the keyboard.

Project Design and Print Screen

This screen shows the different designs for making a project. From this screen you can select a project design, print the project design, print the project instructions, get some interesting facts related to the project, find something fun to do, or have Aunt Annie tell you a story or poem.

The Project Design and Print Screen has four major areas:

- The **action buttons** run down the left side of the screen.
- The **design display** is in the center of the screen. Icons for up to twelve different project designs can be displayed here. A design is selected by clicking on its icon with the mouse or moving to it with the cursor keys.
- The **information window** is at the bottom center of the screen. Simple instructions and quick help are displayed here. To see quick help for a button or design icon, point at it with the mouse.
- The **back/next arrows** are displayed in the lower right corner of the screen if there are more than twelve project designs available. Only twelve project designs can be displayed on the project design and print screen at one time. The <u>Back and Next arrows are used to switch from one set of design icons to another when there are more than twelve designs.</u>

ACTION BUTTONS

This action button is used to go to the instructions for the selected project design. Go to the instructions by clicking on the $\underline{\mathbf{How}}\ \underline{\mathbf{To}}$ button with the mouse or by pressing the 'T' on the keyboard.

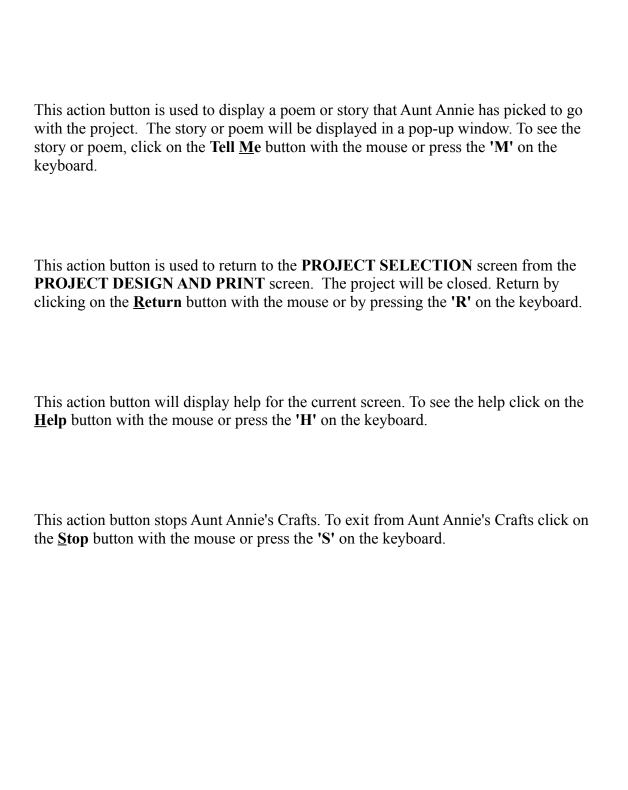
This action button is used to print a project design or the instructions for a project. The **PRINT PROJECT OR HOW TO** dialog box is displayed by this button. Print by clicking on the **Print** button with the mouse or by pressing the **'P'** on the keyboard.

This action button is used to get interesting facts and something fun to do for the project. The facts and fun will be displayed in a pop-up window. Get facts and fun by clicking on Aunt Annie's Crafts

How To Do the Project Screens

These screens display the instructions for doing a project - one step per screen. In addition to seeing the project instructions, you can print the project design, print the project instructions, get some interesting facts related to the project, find something fun to do, or have Aunt Annie tell you a story or poem.

The How To Do the Project Screens have four major areas:

- The **action buttons** run down the left side of the screen.
- The **instruction display** is in the center of the screen. Usually one instruction step is displayed at a time. To go to the next step use the **Next** arrow button. To go back to the previous step use the **Back** arrow button. The **Home** key takes you to the first step and the **End** key takes you to the last step.
- The **information window** is at the bottom center of the screen. Simple instructions and quick help are displayed here. To see quick help for a button, point at it with the mouse.
- The **back/next arrows** are displayed in the lower right corner of the screen. The <u>Back</u> arrow button is used to go to the previous step of the instructions. The <u>Back</u> arrow button will only be available if there is a previous step. The <u>Next arrow button</u> is used to see the next instruction step. The <u>Next arrow button</u> will only be available if there is a next step.

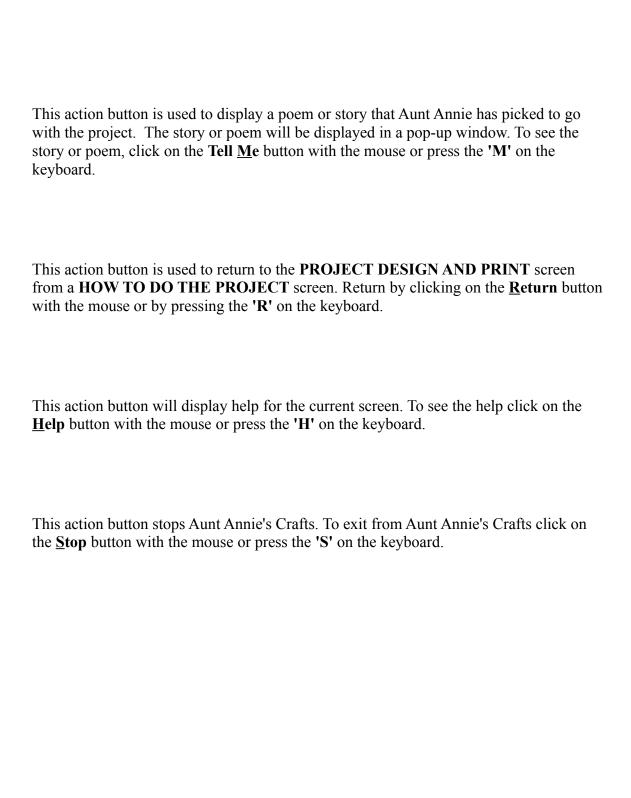
ACTION BUTTONS

Use this action button to get a tip or a hint on how to do the project. There is a different tip for each project step. To get a tip, click on the $\underline{\mathbf{T}}$ ip button with the mouse or press the ' \mathbf{T} ' on the keyboard.

This action button is used to print a project design or the instructions for a project. The **PRINT PROJECT OR HOW TO** dialog box is displayed by this button. Print by clicking on the **Print** button with the mouse or by pressing the **'P'** on the keyboard.

This action button is used to get interesting facts and something fun to do for the project.

Print Project and How To Dialog

This dialog box allows you to print the project design or the project instructions. You can also preview the project design, print a test page, and setup the printer.

The dialog box has two areas:

- The **information box** is in the center of the screen. It lists the name of the project design to be printed, and the printer to be used. In the **Current print setup** box it lists printer and page setup options currently selected.
- The **buttons** run down the right side of the dialog box and along the bottom. The print buttons are on the right side, and the dialog box buttons are along the bottom.

Print Setup Dialog

This dialog box allows you to select a printer, change page layout, and set the number of copies to print.

The dialog box has five areas:

- The **Printer** group box is at the top of the dialog box. Use the drop down list box to select a printer and the **Printer Setup...** button to access the printer's setup. You may want to use the printer's setup to select paper orientation (portrait or landscape) or to set the printer resolution (DPI) on a dot-matrix printer.
- The **Page Layout** group box in the lower left corner lets you control how Aunt Annie prints a page. Use these options to adjust the page location if the printed project doesn't fit on the paper. You can use **Scale** to reduce the printed page size by a percentage. (70% 100%) Use **Horizontal and Vertical Offsets** to shift the printed page. Valid values are from -1.0 to 1.0 inches. Shift right with a positive horizontal value. Shift left with a negative horizontal value. Shift down with a positive vertical value. Shift up with a negative vertical value. Shifting left or up may cause some of the printed page to be lost. Use the print **Test** button to check your page layout values.
- The **How To Steps per Page** group box, in the lower right corner, sets the number of steps that will be printed on a page. Use 2 or 8 steps per page with portrait paper orientation. Use 1 or 4 steps per page with landscape paper orientation. (Use **Printer Setup...** button to change paper orientation.)
- Enter the number of copies to print in the **Copies** edit box near the center of the dialog box. Use this option if you need to print more than one copy of a project or set of instructions
- The **Dialog Box** buttons are on the right side of the box. Use them to accept changes, get help, or exit without making any changes.

Aunt Annie's Crafts Printing Tips

Selecting a Printer

Aunt Annie's Crafts will use the default Windows printer unless told otherwise. You can select a printer for use with Aunt Annie's Crafts from the **Print Setup** dialog box. From the **Print Project and How To** dialog box click the **Setup...** button. Now you will see the **Print Setup** dialog box. Select a printer from the printer drop down list box. When you click **OK** in the **Print Setup** dialog box, this printer is saved and will be used for all future prints.

Getting Print to Fit on Page

Some printers do not report their page size accurately to Windows. When this happens, some of the project print will be missing or messed-up. This can be corrected by scaling the print page. From the **Print Project and How To** dialog box click the **Setup...** button. Now you will see the **Print Setup** dialog box. Enter a value in the **Scale** edit box to reduce the printed page size by a percentage. Valid values are 70% to 100%. When you click **OK** in the **Print Setup** dialog box, this value is saved and will be used on all future prints. Use the **Test** print button in the **Print Project and How To** dialog box to see if the new setting works. Clicking this button will cause a test page to be printed. The test page has a rectangle with diagonal lines running from corner to corner. In the top part of the page are the words **TEST PRINT** on two lines. On the bottom part of the page are the words **Test Print** on two lines. To the left of the page is the word **TYLER** written vertically. To the right of the page are the words **Test Print** written at an angle. Keep adjusting your setting until you see all of the test page.

Printing More than One Copy

Use the **Print Setup** dialog box to tell Aunt Annie to print more than one copy of a project or how to. From the **Print Project and How To** dialog box click the **Setup...** button. Now you will see the **Print Setup** dialog box. Enter a value in the **Copies** edit box. When you click **OK** in the **Print Setup** dialog box, this value is saved and will be used on all future prints.

Making Dot-matrix Printers Faster

Reduce the number of dots per inch (DPI) to make the prints go faster. Most of Aunt Annie's projects look fine when printed with resolutions as low as 90 DPI. From the **Print Project and How To** dialog box click the **Setup...** button. Now you will see the **Print Setup** dialog box. Click the **Printer Setup...** button to start the printer's setup

dialog box. You will be able to set the printer's DPI in this dialog box or one of its lower level dialog boxes.
