1.6 How to use TimePiece

Apart from simply typing TimePiece on the command line, if you wish to be able to launch programs you must have a file called timepiece.menu in s:

This file will look something like this..

MENU Utilities MENU

ITEM Calculator ITEM

COMD sys:tools/calculator COMD

ITEM Read ITEM

COMD sys:tools/mi COMD

OUIT

MENU is the title of the main menu.

ITEM is the itemname in the menu.

COMD will run that command when the ITEM directly above it is selected.

QUIT is used to show the end of the menu file.
