# Notes on setting up a game disk:

To create a Dungeon of Doom disk first start with a blank disk and place a **System** file on it. Then using the Font-DA mover remove all but the system fonts (geneva 9, geneva 12, Chicago 12, monaco 9) from the disk. Next remove all desk accessories from the system file leaving only a Control Panel DA. This has to be done in order for you to be able to win the game. As the game progresses a lot of invisible files are created on the disk so if you do not follow this procedure correctly there will not be enough room on the disk to make it to the 40<sup>th</sup> level. Do not put a **Finder** or **ANY** other system files on the disk. Next move the **Dungeon of Doom** application file to the disk along with this file and the **StartupScreen**. **Please** be sure to place this file on the disk so others who may copy it from you will have it also. The final step is to select the **Dungeon of Doom** application file and go to the Special menu and make it the startup application. That's it. You now have a complete Dungeon of Doom game disk.

You disk should contain the following:

**System**

**Dungeon of Doom**

**setup (README)** <----- this file

**StartupScreen**

As you play the game it will make all the other files it needs including the **Hall of Legends**. To erase all the old high scores simply throw the **Hall of Legends** file in the trash. You may notice that there are no instructions to the game. No, this is not because I am lazy. Some hints can be obtained in the online help section but all the secrets in the game must be found by you. Keep the shareware spirit up and send in the money, it's the only way one will go to a better Dungeon of Doom and beyond.
