## Introduction to Cigar Box for Windows

Remember the cigar boxes you kept on top of your dresser or under your bed when you were a kid? Each full of your "Good Stuff"? Here is the *Windows* version to help you organize the programs and files that you don't use quite often enough to warrant putting them into Program Manger groups. When you open a *Cigar Box* it automatically reads the associated directory(s) and creates an icon for each of the files you are interested in. Double-clicking these icons will execute the represented file or associated program; just as if it were contained in a regular Program Manager group.

Here are some ideas for how you can use *Cigar Box for Windows* to organize your "Good Stuff":

• Toss all your "Old" correspondence into a *Cigar Box* for safekeeping.

• Create a *Cigar Box* to hold all the files in the projects you are working on, then put all the *Cigar Boxes* in a "Projects" Program Manager Group.

• Create a "\TRASH" directory *Cigar Box* to hang on to all those things you think you should get rid of, but want to think about for a while.

• School class notes - set up a separate directory and *Cigar Box* for each class.

• Create a *Cigar Box* to hold all those little *Windows* utilities that you need every so often.

• Games taking over your desktop? Put them all in a *Cigar Box*, each game in it's own subdirectory.

• If you are a programmer, use a *Cigar Box* for each of those sample code disks that came in the backs of all those books.

## Menu Command "File"

## • File|New Directory...

File|New opens a dialog from which you may choose a new *Cigar Box* current directory, and/or change the kinds of files displayed in *Cigar Box*'s main window. These changes are not made permanently; to do that you must change the command line parameters for the program manager icon used to run this instance of *Cigar Box*.

Check the boxes that are included on the dialog to indicate what kinds of files should be displayed:

- Subdirectories - Files are selected from subdirectories of the current directory.

- Executables - Executable programs are displayed using the program's icon if it has one, otherwise a <u>standard icon</u> is used.

- Help Files - Windows "Help" files are displayed.

- Associated - Files with a File Manager association are displayed. The icon used is the associated applications' if it has one, otherwise a <u>standard Windows icon</u> is used.

#### • File|Exit

File|Exit closes the *Cigar Box* (terminates the program).

Windows Help Files

## Menu Command "Applications"

### • Applications Arrange Icons

Applications|Arrange Icons will arrange all the program/file icons in *Cigar Box's* main window into neat rows and columns. You may wish to do this after resizing the window, or "dragging" icons to new locations.

Note that rearranging the icons will not permanently place them in those positions. The next time you open this *Cigar Box* the good stuff will again be displayed in the sequence in which they appear within the directories on your disk drive.

#### • Applications|Exit

Applications|Exit closes the Cigar Box (terminates the program).

#### Applications (Application Names)

Choose a application name from the list to execute. If you do not see the application you want, choose More Windows...

#### • Applications | More Windows...

A scrolling listbox is displayed from which you may choose any of the applications displayed in *Cigar Box's* main window. You may also select an application from the main window by double-clicking it with your mouse, or use Ctrl-F6 (or Shift-Ctrl-F6) to select it and then press "Enter".

# Menu Command "Help"

## Help|Contents

Displays the <u>Table of Contents</u> of the application's "Help" file. From that list you may select a topic of interest.

#### • Help|Search for Help on...

Displays a dialog from which you may select a "Help" topic of interest, based on a <u>keyword</u> <u>search</u>.

## • Help|How to Use Help

Presents a tutorial on how to use the <u>Windows help</u> system.

## Help|About...

<u>Displays some information</u> about *Cigar Box*, it's author, and your system.

## How to setup Cigar Box in Program Manager

• You can add as many *Cigar Box* icons to your Program Manager groups as you need. Each can contain it's own good stuff. You can copy an existing *Cigar Box* icon from one group to another by holding down the "Ctrl" key and dragging the icon to the new group. You can also drag CIGARBOX.EXE from File Manager and drop it on a group, or just use the "File|New" menu in Program Manager to create a new Program Item.

Setup the Program Manager Program Item Properties in the following manner:

• **Description:** Your choice (exercise your ingenuity!)

• **Command line:** The complete path to CIGARBOX.EXE followed by parameters that control what files are included in this Cigar Box. These parameters have the indicated effects:

**S** - Include files found in this directories' subdirectories.

- E Include executable files
- H Include Windows "Help" files
- A Include files with a File Manager association.

Parameters can be upper or lower case, separate or all run together. You must leave a space between ...EXE and the first parameter. You may use DOS "switch" indicators (- or /) if you like, but they are not necessary. The example shown below will display all of the "Help" files in the Windows directory. To make the example show all of the executable programs, change the "H" to "E".

Here are some additional examples of valid parameters:

/S /A All associated files in this directory & subdirectories.

- SA Same as above
- -e H All executables & Help files in the directory

• **Working Directory:** Set to the directory containing the files to be contained in this *Cigar Box*.

• **Shortcut key:** You may enter a unique "hot-key" combination to open this *Cigar Box* with a couple of keystrokes.

• **Run Minimized:** Clear this checkbox so Cigar Box will run as a window, not an icon.

## A Word about System Resources

*Windows* is limited in the amount of graphics, icons, fonts, etc. that can be displayed at any one time. Program Manager Groups and the icons they contain each consume a portion of System Resources. Similarly, *Cigar Box* uses System Resources for each icon created. The System Resources are returned when you close the *Cigar Box*.

System Resources can be used at an astounding rate if, for instance, you ask *Cigar Box* to show you all the executable programs on your hard drive! To guard against an inadvertent crash of your system under similar circumstances, *Cigar Box* will inform you if System Resources are depleted by 50%. You may respond:

• "Yes" - The operation continues and you will again be warned again if System Resources are further depleted by 50%

- "No" The operation is stopped with the icons displayed being retained.
- "Cancel" Abort the operation and return all Resources.

You may learn the amount of System Resources available at any time by choosing "About..." from the "Help" menu of *Cigar Box*, Program Manager, or File Manager.

## **Deinstalling Cigar Box for Windows**

HOW TO REMOVE Cigar Box for Windows FROM YOUR SYSTEM

Sorry this program does not meet your needs. Here is what you do to get rid of it:

The files originally installed on your hard disk were:

#### CIGARBOX.EXE CIGARBOX.HLP

These two files should be together in the directory in which they were installed. The default installation directory is "C:\CIGARBOX", but any directory could have been used. If you are unsure where they are located choose "Search.." from the File Manager "File" menu and enter "CIGARBOX.\*" as the file name to search for. Choose the root directory of the installation drive (most commonly "C:\") and choose to search all subdirectories. When you locate the files simply delete them.

If you installed *Cigar Box for Windows* in it's own directory, that is, by itself, you need only select that directory in File Manager and click "Delete".

If the *Cigar Box for Windows* icons created during the installation are still in their own group (and you have added nothing else to the group) just select the group in Program Manager, and from the Program Manager File Menu choose "Delete".

If you have moved the icons to other groups you will have to track them all down and delete them individually from those groups.

Please pass your installation disk along to someone else... maybe they can use the program (and the author can use the registration fees!)
