

Gamla in the Golan Heights (Gaulanitis at the time of Jesus and the apostles) stood on a high ridge in the middle of a steep valley that ran down to the southwest to the Kinneret, or Sea of Galilee. In this view, to the west, the south ridge of the valley, the Nahal Daliyth (see Slide 12), blocks the view to the sea (background, upper right). At right center one can see the east part of the city wall with its towers, which runs up the hill from the left to the ridge and then back down again to its turn to the west. At lower right the tents of the excavators are visible.
