Welcome to Angela's Cat Notes. This is a little music appreciation program for kids. Hope your kids enjoy it.

Installation:

- 1. Install the program CATNOTE.EXE in the directory of your choice. Make sure PATCH.INI is copied to the same directory.
- 2. Make sure you have a copy of VBRUN300.DLL in your Windows\System directory. This is a Visual Basic 3.0 program and this DLL is required for the program to run. I have not supplied a copy of this file due to its size. You may obtain a copy from most BBS systems.
- 3. Copy THREED.VBX to your Windows\System directory. This VBX is supplied with the program and is required by the program for operation. Make sure it is the ONLY copy in your PATH so that an earlier version is not loaded by mistake when the program runs.
- 4. Install the program in the Program Manager Group of your choice.
- 5. Double-click the program icon to start the program.

Note:

You must have a sound card capable of MIDI play, Windows 3.X and the appropriate sound card drivers installed for this program to work. Your computer and Windows installation must be MultiMedia sound capable.

Operation:

You may adjust the Volume by adjusting the Volume Slide below the picture box. 128 different instrument sounds may be set by changing the Instrument Slide Bar. The piano may be turned Off to allow other MIDI programs to operate and turned back On to play. The Keyboard is played by clicking the mouse on the appropriate piano key. Each time a key is pressed a little animal appears in the picture box (a little added enjoyment). If you click on the picture box the picture will be cleared and a new background color will be displayed. A double-click on the picture box will display the About Box for the program. Note you may drag the mouse (mouse button down) across the keyboard for rapid key play, just like a real piano.

That is all there is to it. Hope you enjoy it.

Distribution:

The program is supplied as Freeware. This means you may use the program free of charge, but you may not sell it for profit. Free means Free to all.

Liability:

I can assume no lability for any loss you may associate with the use of this program. I have tested it on my computers and have experienced no problems. However, due to variation in computing equipment I can make no guarantee about the program operation on your equipment.
